- (10) The Carnegie Fund for Authors grants emergency assistance to needy writers who've published at least one book by traditional publisher to help in time of natural disaster. Not for projects.
- (11) Writer's Emergency Fund, for acute emergencies. Editors and column writers also eligible.

Last Butte Sheriff update was 8/15: The Butte County Sheriff's Office said it positively identified the remains of 68-year-old Judith Sipher of Paradise. Two of the 86 victims remain unknown.

- 4/26: Please read the information about water in the burn zone in the REPOPULATION section, below. Quote from recent article, "For now, there are strict warnings that people moving back in should not drink or even boil the water, let alone use it for any household activity unless it has been tested. Whelton says some residents are buying water filtration systems that aren't proven to be safe enough to handle the high VOC readings, or they're relying on a single-point-in-time test for contaminants." Please see SUPPLIES section for water. Also: Free potable water in Paradise for the public! Town of Paradise, M-Sa 9a-4p at Nazarene Church, 311 Circlewood Drive. Refill water bottles, water tanks, RVs or trailers!
- **4/8:** Man suspected of using Camp Fire victim IDs to create fraudulent checks; <u>40 victims</u> of identity theft.
- **2/23:** Organizations warn against disaster fraud after wildfires (Camp Fire focused article). Pay particular attention when charismatic individuals offer help, ask you to contribute money to personal accounts so *they* can distribute it, or ask for money and then say they will be sending the intended recipient gift cards (which they get from a nonprofit, for free, by purporting to help survivors, and either never send, or skim some off the top for themselves). Scammers set themselves up as the only one who can help, or the only one who *really* cares about you and gets things done. And yet... Beware.
- 2/21: Living in an RV/tent/trailer? Use only approved heating devices, NOT gas ovens, stovetops, non-approved gas heaters, charcoal barbeques, or any non-vented gas or propane heaters! Make sure generator isn't venting exhaust into the vehicle. Install an approved CO2 detector. Carbon monoxide is odorless, and absolutely deadly. Signs of CO2 poisoning: headache, nausea, dizziness, breathlessness, collapse. How to stay warm in your RV during freezing weather
- 1/29: IRS does NOT email. -per Kim Smith, who works there. If you receive an email saying you're eligible to claim a tax refund, or appear to be targeted by ANY scam, please report to the Butte Co. fraud hotline, 866-323-7283
- 1/29: From a police officer: If someone offers to sell you a trailer, says it will be delivered to you, and they are out of state (and not working with one of the organizations in our REHOUSING section), consider walking away. Do not give them money.
- 1/23: Do not give your social security number or citizenship ID numbers to anyone online, unless you are at a FEMA or other .gov page with a padlock icon in the search bar.
- 1/18: Caution to those using **Norcal Home Design** out of Vacaville. Please call Brenda at 530-370-5302 and if you're using them, please let the Butte County Sheriff and Paradise Police know.
- 1/12: Chico Police Dept. lists names of those whose identifying info. may have been recently compromised and are at risk of identity theft. If your name is on this list, please contact Officer A. Madden and refer to case #19-000173, 530-897-4998, ext. 1068, or email.
- 12/24: Paradise Police reports scammers calling themselves "PG&E" call and tell people they have to pay bill in full for "Sept & Oct." The number they give sounds legit, but is not. This is a SCAM. Hang up and please contact your local police dept. ONGOING: Do not shower or drink or cook

with tap water in Paradise or Del Oro water districts or allow animals to consume it! See "repopulation" section, below, for more information.

As long as you fill out a needs list, you will never run out of FREE DELIVERED OAK. All oak is split by hand. Will clean your exhaust/chimney in 2 weeks so non-seasoned wood can be burned. MANY cats have been found already; many more pets have been found every single day, even in/around totally burned out houses! Animals are resilient! Enlist friends or volunteers to help you find your pet, or even strangers you might meet in town or at a community meeting. Everyone wants to feel needed right now! Enlist others to help you search all the links online, below, for a pic of your pet (as well as regularly posting one everywhere!), and can offer support when you go to physically look for your pet. Create a flyer at HelpingLostPets.com to get your animal placed on their map and to get a flyer.

FYI: It is very unusual for animal rescuers to seek personal donations

---Want to Help Remotely?

There's no more important thing you can do right this minute to help CF pets and owners than to try to match them! (There are 1,006 owners seeking their pets and over 1K pets in our database! Pets have been in the burn zone for almost 6 months, alone. **Many** found daily!)

ANNOUNCEMENT for CAT and DOG SEARCHERS! We

(#DisasterAssistTeam) have a comprehensive, publicly searchable database of all found Camp Fire pets so that owners and others trying to help remotely only have to go to one site to look! The database is searchable by very detailed tags. It gives any data we have on the animals (address found, videos, contact info). (See #2, below, for link.) As of 6/8, we have over 1,325 cats there!

First...you need a lost cat or dog to search for! See the next 2 sections (searching for a dog, searching for a cat) for where to find one!

---Searching for a Cat?

(1) Gather pics of your beloved cat, as detailed as possible. Study them carefully for anything distinctive about your kitty. If you're searching for someone else's kitty remotely, you'll need a lost cat to search for! See #2, below, to find pics of lost kitties; choose one who tugs at your heart, download the pic so you have it handy, and study it carefully.

People post pics of their lost pets there; finders post animals they've found there immediately. Check frequently! You'll see many pics of lost cats there. On the Camp Fire Paradise Ca Area page, there are links to pages of certain kinds of cats owners are searching for: Siamese, Persian, white, polydactyl, tortoise, calico, black & white, black, tabby, etc. *If you're not on Facebook*, here is a <u>google doc of lost CATS owners are looking for!</u>
- (3) Search our #DisasterAssistTeam database of **found** Camp Fire pets! It's updated daily, with over 1,200 pets on it now! <u>HERE ARE THE INSTRUCTIONS (important to read!)</u> AND THE DATABASE LINK!
- (4) If you have a cat in the burn zone: <u>How to locate, track and rescue displaced fire</u> <u>cats</u> and <u>please complete this form for continued volunteer care.</u> [also see PET IN THE BURN ZONE section, below].
- (5) For all matchers and owners searching for their cats: remember that PICTURES can look very, very different from real life. Long hair can become short, colors can alter due to camera lenses, lighting, or smoke/ash. Black cats frequently become tan in the sunshine. The same tabby can look light gray or bright tan. If you have an inkling s/he may be the cat you're seeking, call the shelter. Go look in person! When you find another person's cat, message/email/tweet/call them! It's working! MANY HUNDREDS of cats have been reunited this way so far! (You'll see people are desperate for their cats, as they've been missing for nearly 3 months, and are/have been in a very inhospitable and toxic environment.) When you find your own cat, please let the places you posted s/he was lost know! If the cat was listed on our database, please let us know (see instructions for contacts!).

Do not give up! Dozens of pets being found alive daily! ***FILL OUT THIS REQUEST FOR ANIMAL RESCUE FORM***

If you go into the burn zone, take pet food and water and bowls with you, and leave them around. There are many there; they are thirsty and hungry. Cats, in particular, tend to appear at dusk (they are nocturnal animals, and have been without artificial light for months).

(1) From @BCWildfire: pet search offers from locals. (2) If you are no longer in the area, send PM to Julie Ohashi (whether or not house standing) on Facebook. Give exact address location and gate or barn access info. Give detailed animal's description, your name and number, for food/water/rescue, and fill out those forms, above (trapper permission)! (3) Post your missing animal, search other posts, on CampFire Pet Rescue and Reunification and Cowboy911 (also check Cowboy411). Rescued animals being posted on those sites by volunteer rescuers every day! (4) 1/20: If you're having trouble trapping your pet, please contact Haji Ward: catadvocateteam@gmail.com.

In the meantime, please see "Searching for a Cat?" and "Searching for a Dog or Other Animal?" above. Keep checking back for WEEKS. Your pet may wander down to the City of Chico, or up into Chester, etc. Most pets have been found very near or at their homes, even when homes have burned down, but not all. If your home has burned, return with food & water, call your pet, and continue to do so daily! MANY arrive with food, call their pet, wait until dusk, and their pet comes running! Animals have survived in horrific conditions. If you're local, consider making/leaving a warm shelter. Leave shelters away from roads or workers. Instructions for how to make one (make sure it has 2 entrances for escape from predators). Here's a thread with MANY OPTIONS and detailed instructions! In other fires, many families have found their pets alive months and years after the fire passed. Keep checking shelters (see below) and our found Camp Fire database, updated daily with new found pets and sightings!! Animals are very resilient (when glass breaks in windows, they run). Many people believe their animal couldn't have survived...but they did! There are over 1325 cats, as of 6/8, in shelters and foster, hoping for their families to find them!

---How you can help from near/far

Pets in the burn zone and in shelters need additional help to be reunited with owners. (1) Hundreds still in the burn zone need to be FED - WATERED - KEPT WARM each day (locals can help!). ---FOR LOCALS

- (a) Volunteer to place food/water in feeding stations for sheltering-in-place in lower Paradise. *Urgent need.* Please contact Julie via email or Volunteer coordinator, Michelle 530 680 7203. Feed/water stations must be filled daily. Feeding maintenance is ~1 hour x 3 times/week.
- (b) Please help make/place shelters for pets still sheltering-in-place in lower Paradise in the burn zone (there are 350 feeding stations there). If you are an owner or caretaker of kitties inside the burn zone and in need of shelters/feeding stations, please go to 925 American Way.. Help is also needed making the shelters. Each one takes about an hour to put together. We have a prototype that is easy to follow and supplies ready to get started on ASAP! Or, make your own shelters out of covered tubs w/straw--here's how); make sure there are 2 entrances (to escape predators). Setting up shelters and feeding stations is a commitment of ~ 3-4 hours one time.

They also need customer service onsite to answer phones/texts/emails from possible owners and check to see that there is a match, send videos/pics, reunite pets! Also looking for transporters at the FieldHaven Feline Center Transfer Station in Paradise to shuttle just-rescued burn zone kitties to the Recovery Center in Marysville and to spay/neuter at BHS in Chico (early morn & mid-afternoon 2-3 days/week. Marysville shuttle several days/week, early afternoon. Please contact Fieldhaven, 530-777-9080, or Email Fieldhaven Here! Transporters are also needed to transport supplies from Chico to Paradise. Please text (808) 649-8486 to be added to the transporter contact list for future needs.

- (4) REUNITE CAMP FIRE PETS WITH THEIR OWNERS: This is wildly rewarding! Help match photos of found cats to owners' photos of lost pets in order to clear space in shelters, and in Fieldhaven/Alley Cat Allies Recovery Center, Base Camp, and Paradise Transfer Center (consistently full). This can be done from anywhere! Our Disaster Assist Team uploaded a comprehensive, publicly searchable database of all found Camp Fire pets, so that owners and others trying to help remotely do not need to scroll past hundreds of pets, or search dozens of sites, which can be upsetting and frustrating. The database is searchable by very detailed tags. It gives any data we have on the animals (some have address found, extra pics, videos, notes on the pet). HERE ARE THE INSTRUCTIONS (important!) AND LINK! (<--quick start at top of that document!) Also, go back and read the other resources on the instruction page, in case you can't find the pet you're searching for!
- (5) PET OWNERS NEED TO KNOW WHERE TO LOOK: We've found that many pet owners who've left the area, don't realize how many pets survived. Earlier comments by Butte County Animal Control left them with the erroneous impression that all pets have either been adopted out, or could not have survived. (a) You can help inform the general public that may are still alive, and there are quick ways to search for them. The Butte County website went down on 2/28. Our database offers one quick way to search for Camp Fire Pets (see #4). Another is to contact news outlets to let them know Camp Fire pets are still alive and awaiting owners! (See Who to Contact To Spread the Word, below). (b) Need people interested in running booths at

the Saturday & Thursdays markets in Chico. Connect with the public, explain what we're doing to rescue and reunify pets. Contact Julie at (808) 649-8486.

---SELF-HELP

CLICK HERE for effective, research-based self-help tips that WILL help you and your kids with anxiety, fear, insomnia, anger, grief, nightmares, poor memory, loss, confusion (all normal for some time after a disaster!) This document was written by a licensed psychologist for disaster survivors and first responders. Immediate tip: avoid stimulating images and videos, as your nervous system is taxed and needs the sensory environment to be as calm as possible. Use the techniques in the link above to achieve calm amidst the (fire)storm. Here is one of them: THIS IS EXTREMELY EFFECTIVE at reducing panic & high anxiety immediately: 5-4-3-2-1 requires you to concentrate intently across multiple physical modalities, forcing the neurotransmitter norepinephrine (which triggers the amygdala and your overwrought stress response system) to stop surging. It is immediately effective. Pick a spot you want to look at, and keep your eyes focused on it without moving them at all (blinking is okay) throughout this exercise. Name (out loud, or silently if not alone) 5 things you see in your peripheral vision, without moving your eyes; look as far "out" from center without moving your eyes as you can. Next, name 5 things you hear. Listen intently. If you can't hear 5 things, repeat something, but keep listening intently. Remember, your voice is one! Next, name 5 things you feel -- not emotionally, but physically (your foot on the ground, your hand on your lap, etc.). Make sure you are feeling them, not just listing them. Now, name 4 things you see in your peripheral vision -don't move your eyes! 4 things you hear. 4 things you feel. Then, 3... and so on until you've finished 1-1-1. Then, sit quietly for a few moments and let your eyes move normally. Most of us notice deep calm between 3-3-3 and 2-2-2. Repeat as necessary.

Anxiety attacks can also take different forms than panic: unpredictable bouts of rage; irritability; nit-pickiness; hypersensitivity to chaos, disarray, change; fast-talking, stuttering, stumbling over words; not talking at all; sitting rigid, staring into space, "zoning out." Please see this section for help with anxiety, sadness, grief, anger, guilt. See how to help someone with anxiety, here.

It's common to feel upset, disillusioned, depressed after the heroic phase of a wildfire has ended, and the disaster drops out of the news. See the curve here, for what to expect. See here for list of mental health resources in the fire zone. Also, see "After Paradise" weekly series podcast, here.

Are you a **first responder, educator, working for a nonprofit, helping survivors** in other ways? <u>This article on secondary traumatic stress is excellent.</u> And <u>this is a fact sheet on STS</u> (applies to everyone in the disaster helping field).

<u>Grief Recovery FB group!</u> The #1 most protective thing you can do for your mental health, according to a trove of research, is to **seek social support**, and that includes any activity that leaves you feeling connected to others--in person contact iis best, but online also has been shown to help! Even sitting in a library or cafe around other people, without interacting, helps!

CHILDREN: SEE TOP OF THIS SECTION for free, 6-week trauma parenting class! Tip from homeowner: Consider marking septic & leach field with colored tape & rebar to make sure they don't drive over them.

---5 Urgent Burn Zone Animal Needs (3/23)

Pets in the burn zone and in shelters need additional help to be reunited with owners. (1) Hundreds still in the burn zone need to be FED - WATERED - KEPT WARM each day (anyone can help!). (2) Many still need to be RESCUED (anyone can help!). (3) Rescued pets need A PLACE TO BE SAFELY SHELTERED AND CARED FOR (locals and anyone else can help!). (4) Those sheltered need to be REUNITED with owners (anyone can help!). (5) PET OWNERS NEED TO LEARN where to look for their pet!

- (1) FEED WATER KEEP WARM: FOR LOCALS
- (a) Volunteer to place food/water in feeding stations for sheltering-in-place in lower Paradise. *Urgent need.* Please contact Julie via email or Volunteer coordinator,

Michelle 530 680 7203. Feed/water stations must be filled daily. Feeding maintenance is ~1 hour x 3 times/week.

(b) Please help make/place shelters for pets still sheltering-in-place in lower Paradise in the burn zone (there are 350 feeding stations there). If you are an owner or caretaker of kitties inside the burn zone and in need of shelters/feeding stations, please go to 925 American Way or Base Camp at 7035 Pentz in Paradise. Help is also needed making the shelters. Each one takes about an hour to put together. We have a prototype that is easy to follow and supplies ready to get started on ASAP! Or, make your own shelters out of covered tubs w/straw--here's how); make sure there are 2 entrances (to escape predators). Place on your private property in the burn zone, or away from private property and roads. Please contact Julie via email about current shelter-in-place needs. Setting up shelters and feeding stations is a commitment of ~ 3-4 hours one time.

- (c) Seeking bags of dry cat food (this is on ongoing need). - (d) Need wood stove pellets for litter. Can be ordered online at <u>Tractor Supply Co.</u> in Chico, CA (pick up location must be Chico, CA). Then forward the email confirmation <u>here</u>. It must include order # & the full name order was placed under so that transporters can pick up.
- (2) PET RESCUE--FOR ANYONE: (a) If you can, purchase trail cameras and/or SD cards for trappers off of Camp Fire Cat Search & Rescue team's Amazon wishlist here. More cameras are needed! Photos and videos of sighted cats are then posted daily on our database, owners recognize them, and trappers target those cats, contact owner, and they go directly home instead of to shelter! (b) Donate gas cards for rescuers and pet transports. Chevron and Amerigas are closest to Paradise. Julie Ohashi: "Please mail to our boots on the ground volunteer who will distribute to trappers and supply runners: Wanda Stelling 2162 Robailey Dr. Chico CA 95928 (530) 570-5310." (c) Boots on the Ground Special Operations! We need

(3) SAFE SHELTER--FOR ANYONE:

- (a) Identify more fosters and no-kill shelters willing to take Camp Fire pets, so that more pets can be rescued from the burn zone and have a place to go until their owners can be found. If you have tried to foster before and were deterred (too far away/didn't hear back/etc.) contact us. We need fosters badly! Fill out this form first and someone WILL be in touch with you. We especially need fosters for special needs kitties. Text (808) 649-8486 if you don't hear back within a few days! Know anyone in California or surrounding areas who has a direct contact to a legit 501(c)3 non profit organization that truly operates under the no kill philosophy? We need partnerships to send special needs cats to--those who take more time to find homes for those who don't do well in the local dog/cat pound, including shy guys needing diffusion period, seniors, FIV+, upper respiratory cats, neonatal bottle baby kittens, Heartworm+, moms with litters (2 mo. commitment), ferals needing safe outdoor placement. - (b) LOCAL? Volunteer with Fieldhaven! Staff the Fieldhaven Paradise Transfer Center, 5399 Clark Rd. at Ewald, Paradise--the building directly to the left of the transfer station trailer; look for the stairs! Needs kennel cleaners/socializers 9:30a-8p daily. Cats are initially taken here once trapped. Sign up here. Fieldhaven/Alley Cat Allies Recovery Center shelter, 620 9th St., Marysville (longer-term shelter), needs kennel cleaners/socializers 9a-6p daily; sign up here. They also need customer service onsite to answer phones/texts/emails from possible owners and check to see that there is a match, send videos/pics, reunite pets! Also looking for transporters at the FieldHaven Feline Center Transfer Station in Paradise to shuttle just-rescued burn zone kitties to the Recovery Center in Marysville and to spay/neuter at BHS in Chico (early morn & mid-afternoon 2-3 days/week. Marysville shuttle several days/week, early afternoon. Please contact Fieldhaven, 530-777-9080, or Email Fieldhaven Here! Transporters are also needed to transport supplies from Chico to Paradise. Please text (808) 649-8486 to be added to the transporter contact list for future needs.
- (4) REUNITE CAMP FIRE PETS WITH THEIR OWNERS--FOR ANYONE: This is wildly rewarding! Help match photos of found cats to owners' photos of lost pets in order to clear space in shelters, and in Fieldhaven/Alley Cat Allies Recovery Center, Base Camp, and Paradise Transfer Center (consistently full). This can be done from anywhere! Our Disaster Assist Team uploaded a comprehensive, publicly searchable database of all found Camp Fire pets, so that owners and others trying to help remotely do not need to

scroll past hundreds of pets, or search dozens of sites, which can be upsetting and frustrating. The database is searchable by very detailed tags. It gives any data we have on the animals (some have address found, extra pics, videos, notes on the pet). HERE ARE THE INSTRUCTIONS (important!) AND LINK! (<--quick start at top of that document!) Also, go back and read the other resources on the instruction page, in case you can't find the pet you're searching for!

- (5) PET OWNERS NEED TO KNOW WHERE TO LOOK--FOR ANYONE: We've found that many pet owners who've left the area, don't realize how many pets survived. Earlier comments by Butte County Animal Control left them with the erroneous impression that all pets have either been adopted out, or could not have survived.
- (a) You can **help inform the general public** that may are still alive, and there are quick ways to search for them. The Butte County website went down on 2/28. Our database offers one quick way to search for Camp Fire Pets (see #4). Another is to contact news outlets to let them know Camp Fire pets are still alive and awaiting owners! (See Who to Contact To Spread the Word, below).
- (b) Need people interested in **running booths at the Saturday & Thursdays markets in Chico.** Connect with the public, explain what we're doing to rescue and reunify pets. Contact Julie at (808) 649-8486.

WHO WE ARE

We, #DisasterAssistTeam (and #Disaster Assist Team on FB) are a team of remote volunteers with connections on the ground, who came together to help people and animal rescuers find those needing help during major disasters. We do logistics, data mining, research, information sourcing, verifying, vetting. We found that teams on the ground really need people like us. Often, they are stretched thin and don't have reliable access to the internet or a phone, or need reliable people to field offers or direct people or supplies to them. We support BOTG (boots on the ground) and coordinate their efforts, network, match people in need with available resources, advocate for survivors, and work on creative solutions. We also secure donations for and promote other teams and nonprofits who share our most important value: integrity.

Disaster Assist Team came together after Hurricane Harvey, and has helped in over a dozen disasters in the past 2.5 years. Many of us have disaster or animal rescue training, or are in the law enforcement, emergency, animal welfare, equine, or healthcare fields. We have licensed mental health professionals and physicians, corporate professionals, animal lovers, and artists on our team. We are a diverse bunch from several countries, including Australia, New Zealand, the UK, and Canada.

Most of us have experienced disaster in our own lives and wanted to give back by helping others in similar situations. It's difficult, if you haven't been in a disaster, to really understand the trauma that can result when you realize that the Earth doesn't know you're here and cannot protect you during disaster; and the effect on body, mind and spirit of being terrified, your life threatened, not sure you'll survive, forced out of your home (both literally and figuratively), having to leave beloved pets behind, being without a home in an impersonal, large shelter, sleeping on a cot with an unknown future, having lost your community, your employment, and wondering whether your friends, family, pets have survived. Your identity undergoes rapid change. Yesterday, you were a member of your neighborhood and familiar town community; now, you are a refugee.
