Subject: English - Spelling

Grade level: Grade 3

Topic: Proper Spelling

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Students will be able to identify common spelling patterns in grade-appropriate words
- 2. Students will be able to use spelling rules and patterns to spell words correctly
- 3. Students will be able to proofread their own writing for spelling errors

Materials:

List of grade-appropriate spelling words

Spelling worksheets or graphic organizers

Whiteboard and markers

Spelling reference materials (such as dictionaries or word lists)

Procedure:

Introduction:

Begin the lesson by asking the students why proper spelling is important in writing.

Explain that proper spelling helps to make writing clear and easy to read and shows that the writer is knowledgeable and skilled.

Instruction:

Display a list of grade-appropriate spelling words on the board or projector.

Model how to identify common spelling patterns in words, such as prefixes, suffixes, and vowel sounds.
