Manuscript articles must be accompanied by Abstracts in English and Indonesian. Abstract in English is written first and then in Indonesia. An abstract is written in a concise, clear, complete, independent and complete manner describing the essence of the contents of the entire writing that consists brief introduction, method, result and discussion, and conclusion. The abstract is written no more than 150 words. The abstract must be able to provide readers with information on the main topics of the article and the findings of your research. Use the correct diction so that you can describe the results of your research effectively. →10pt, Times New Roman, Italic

Keywords: (Minimum three keywords alphabets and used the semicolon symbol (;) to separate the words) → 10pt, Times New Roman, Italic

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INTRODUCTION → 12pt, Bold, Uppercase, Times New Roman

The manuscript is typed in Microsoft Office Word, A4 paper size, with a paper format of 2.54 cm (Left – Top – Right – Bottom), and portrait orientation. The introduction contains the background for writing an article containing academic anxiety and can be supplemented with statistical data. Authors should include previous research to show the pioneering and novelty of the research. The author should indicate the advantages and disadvantages of previous research, then indicate what you expect from your work (to solve these limitations) which is formulated in the problem statement and research objectives. → **Enter 1 cm tab for each new line, 11pt, Times New Roman, 1.15 spacing then add 6 pt spacing for *before* and *after* each paragraph, and use left and right alignment.**

METHOD → 12pt, Bold, Uppercase, Times New Roman

Every article originating from research results must include research methods. Research methods are a series of technical steps that researchers carry out in their research. No longer discussing the definition of a method. In the research method, it is necessary to include the approach taken, type of research, data source, method of collecting data, and techniques for checking the validity of the data. The method used must be accompanied by a reference. The research method is formulated briefly and clearly → **Enter 1 cm tab for each new line, 11pt, Times New Roman, 1.15 spacing then add 6 pt spacing for *before* and *after* each paragraph, and use left and right alignment**

RESULT AND DISCUSSION → 12pt, Bold, Uppercase, Times New Roman

1. First → Discussion 11pt, Times New Roman, Italic

Research results must be written clearly and concisely. Research results should summarize research findings rather than detailed data. It is recommended to provide a review of the differences between your results or findings and previous research. Discussion is the most important part of your article. Here you get the opportunity to explore your data. Usually, it starts with a summary of research findings and then discusses various related theories or references. The theory or reference used must be accompanied by a clear reference source.

You are not permitted to use *bullets and* numbering *in* subtitles or *body text*. If there is a number in a sentence or a discussion, it is written directly in the paragraph using numbers in brackets, for example, The family has several main functions, including (1) Educational function; (2) Religious Function; (3) Economic Function; (4) and so on. → **Enter 1 cm tab for each new line, 11pt, Times New Roman, 1.15 spacing then add 6 pt spacing for *before* and *after* each paragraph and use left and right alignment**

A sub-discussion can be written in a maximum of two derivatives in the following order: → 11pt, Times New Roman, the distance between the discussion and the sub-discussion and subsequent derivatives is 0.5 cm.

- a. First sub-discussion (sub-discussion title is not italicized)
 - 1) Sub of the first sub-discussion
 - 2) Etc.
- b. Second sub-discussion
 - 1) Sub of the second sub discussion

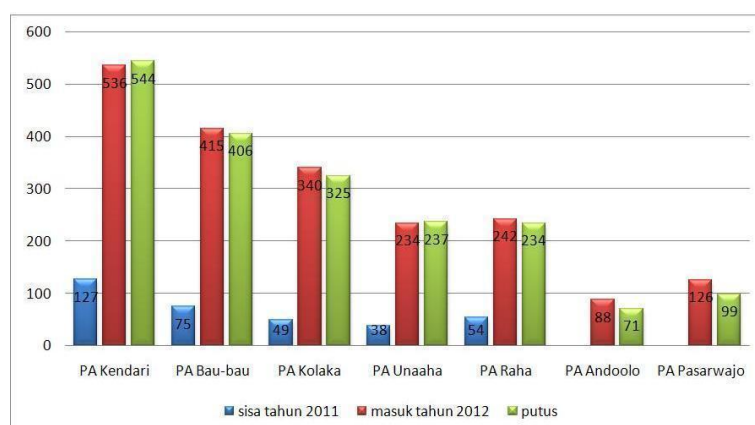


Figure 1. Cases Entered and Decided in Religious Courts

CONCLUSION→ 12pt, Uppercase, Times New Roman, Bold

Conclusions must answer the research objectives formulated briefly and effectively. The conclusion is not a resume of the discussion that has been carried out. The conclusion is expected to contain theoretical implications regarding how your research or thinking can advance the scientific field of family law. Without a clear conclusion, publishers and readers will find it difficult to assess your work. You should also suggest future research and/or show future researchers what should be done. ← Enter 1 cm tab for each new line, 11pt, Times New Roman, 1.15 spacing then add 6 pt spacing for *before and after* each paragraph, and use left and right alignment

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT (If Any)→ 12pt, Uppercase, Times New Roman, Bold

3. Times New Roman font, 11pt, 1.15 spacing
4. Arranged alphabetically
5. At least 30 references in total
6. Use references with a composition of 60% scientific journals, 20% books, and the rest can be from the web, unpublished scientific works, theses, dissertations, and online/print media.
