



AP Human Geography Debriefing Data Sets

History, Grades 9-12

Assignment Objectives

After completing this assignment, students will be able to:

- Identify global, national, and local patterns from a set of data.
- Analyze the significance of the differences in the patterns.
- Construct a written response debriefing the patterns of the set of data.

Teacher Instructions

- Be sure to make a copy of this document if you would like to make any changes to the activity.
- This activity corresponds to the first unit of the AP Human Geography curriculum, but can be used anytime students are working on scales of analysis or regional analysis.
- You will need to provide a set of data for students to analyze on this worksheet, as well as any rubric for the writing.
- Students will be using Paper's Live Help and Paper's Review Center for this assignment.

Ideas for Use

- In class, use a data set and model to your students how to identify the global, national, and local patterns from the data. Have a class discussion around the differences of the patterns and why/how they are significant. Then break students up into groups and have them complete this worksheet with a new set of data.
- Give students a data set from a past AP Human Geography FRQ and have them complete this worksheet identifying and analyzing patterns in the set. After, have students write a sample response to the FRQ using their analysis and submit this FRQ to the Review Center for feedback.
- Have students complete this worksheet individually or as homework as a way to review their scale of analysis and regional analysis skills. In class, have students meet in groups to discuss their analysis and then draft a written response that will be turned into Paper's Review Center.

- Based on these patterns, what larger implications can you infer?

- How do these patterns differ from the global and national patterns?
