Note: if short on debaters, act like there's a dummy debater who comes in last every time; he'll be gone after round 2

#### General notes

- Only policy resolutions will be used
- There will be TWO RESOLUTIONS so as to have plenty of things to discuss (if we only had one rez, we'd probably run outta stuff to talk about pretty quick)
- You can construct an argument at literally any time except the final phase between the top two (but obviously your plans have to stay the same and be presented in the first speech)

#### Committee Discussion

- Bottom 4 in house of Commons
- 1 minute of speaking time at beginning for each debater
- 5 minutes of non-structured discussion
  - Recognizing that non-structured speaking is subject to abuse, judges are advised to take the courtesy of debaters into consideration when making their decisions
- 1 minute of speaking time at the end for each debater
- Announcement of chamber assignment for next round, 2 min of prep

### Discussion Report

- Top 2 in house of Lords
- Top 2 from Commons' committee and bottom 2 from Lords' committee in Commons
- House of Lords will use the following format:

- Prime minister: 2 min- Opposition: 2 min

- Non-structured discussion: 2 min

Prime minister: 1 minOpposition: 1 min

- House of Commons will use the following format:
  - 2 min of speaking for each speaker
  - 3 min of non-structured discussion
