Her mother is a worker making a mosquito net where she earns 1500 kyats (which is less than a dollar with exchange rate these days) per item. Her father lost his job during Covid Pandemic and Coup. Her eldest brother works delivering beverages to diners around the neighborhood and he earns 6000 kyats (equal to about 3.5 \$) a day and gives 4000 kyats (2 \$) back to the family for food. Her second elder brother, herself and the youngest are dependents of the family.

Aye joined the Sharing Love Program of Ywama Baptist Church to learn sewing and crochet. Though there are many children and related families who are in difficult situations, we chose Aye for her commitment



towards her work, eagerness to learn new things and for her hard work. The parents find it very difficult to feed the whole family and it is sad to know that they won't let Aye attend the school when they are open again.

Aye expressed her deepest gratitude to receive this Christmas Gift and was so surprised and happy to receive it. I'm sorry that I couldn't take the recent picture of her and the family because of many limited situations. I attached her pictures that I received from the Sharing Love Program. And of course, it is always a joy to help someone, to be a help for others especially during this Christmas Season.

I am writing this letter to express my sincere gratitude for giving me an opportunity to participate in "Christmas Gift" program made by Friends of Burma (FOB).

During the last week of November, I had received 90,000 MMK to help the most needed person around me. I had a conversation with one of my staff about this program and he told me about a woman who lives in his native village called 'Tanggyi' of Kangyidaunt Township in Delta Region. Her name is Aunty Tala and 60 years old now staying with her two sisters in a tiny bamboo house. Her elder sister is a widow and the younger one is a spinster who is the only one that can support the family.

The main economic in Delta Region is agriculture. Before transition from hand production to machines, women could get regular earnings by working in the farms, but their daily



incomes are not sure for nowadays. In such a way, Aunty Tala's sister can go to the farm at only two rice planting seasons during a year and can get some incomes. For other seasons, she has no regular incomes but has a chance to collect some rice stalks that left in the field during the harvest time. So that the family can meet their daily need for food. Extra income for health care and other expenses are not sure for the family.

This story reminded me of the 'Book of Ruth' and I decided to give 90,000 MMK Gift to Aunty Tala's Family. So I transferred it to her through Wave Money (One of Myanmar mobile Financial Services Providers). Aunty Tala's younger sister cashed out the money and I got a chance to make a call with her. She was excited to receive that gift because the family never expected to get such amount of money as a Christmas gift. She said that she could buy rice bags for about three months and some drugs for Aunty Tala and the oldest one. She said "thank and GOD bless to all the donors" instead of Aunty Tala because aunty is a woman with congenital disability and can't reply to my call.

I am blessed to participate in this program and let me say thank you once again. Let me attach one photo of Aunty Tala that I received from my staff. I am sorry for the quality of the photo. In this photo, what we can see is Aunty Tala putting Thanaka (Myanmar traditional powder for skin care purpose) on her smiley face. Thank you for taking time to read my letter.

I am writing to express my heartfelt gratitude to you for your Christmas love gift (90,000 kyats) given to me by Sayama Dr. Fom Men and Saya Rev. Dr. Thomas Cung Bik. Yesterday I gave this love gift to an orphanage called "New Life" situated in a village in Taik Kyi Township, Yangon. This orphanage is being operated by Saya U Saung (a seminary graduate) and his wife Naw Eh Ka Lu Htoo. There are 24 children in this orphanage who range in age from 3 to 16 years.

Due to the present political situation here, these children do not go to school. A lady is helping them with their school lessons. Their monthly expense is around 800,000-1,000,000 kyats (not including school expenses if they go to school). They do receive donations sometimes. To generate and supplement income, they grow vegetables and breed a few cows, chickens, ducks, goats, fish, etc. If needed, Saya U Saung (His children call him "Ah Pa" (daddy)) is not hesitant to do odd jobs to feed his children. The children are found to be well taken care of and well-behaved.

They are very happy to receive not only your donation but also us (I went there with my wife and two staff from MIT). With the children, we talked, we sang and we ate. The children were excited and happy by our visit. Who would not when shown love and care especially at Christmas time. We are as happy as them also because we, through your help, are able to do something for the needy.

On this visit, I also gave them other donations given to me by a few other donors (The total amount I gave them yesterday was 300,000 kyats). After visiting them in person, I came to know some immediate needs of theirs and now I am talking over with some of my friends to fulfill some of those needs.

Last year you also gave me an opportunity to share your Christmas love gift with two needy persons (One old and poor man who died a couple of months ago, and a Christian minister who is battling with cancer- she is still living).

Again, thank you very much for your love, care and concern for the needy people here. I also thank Dr. Fom Men and Rev. Dr. Thomas for being a channel of blessing.

May God continue to bless you, your family and your ministry abundantly.

#30 A report from Saya Chit Maung and sent to me by my husband.

Dear Dr. Neil and Diana Sowards and FOB Donors.

I asked Saya Chit Maung (a missionary in Dala, Yangon) to give two Christmas gifts to two needy families. He came to collect the gifts and told me that he would give one gift

to a needy family (see **Report - 20**) and the other gift to another poor family. He advised the father of the second family to drive a tricycle to make some money for his family. So he borrowed a tricycle (see pic. 1). He had to pay 1000 kyats per day to the owner. On average he could make about 3000-4000 kyats per day, but after paying 1000 kyats to the owner, he would have 2000-3000 for his family. Saya Chit Maung mentioned that if he owns his own tricycle, he will not need to pay for the rental and will be able to earn more for his family.

I asked Saya Chit Maung how much would be the current price of the tricycle that he had borrowed. He said it would cost between 150,000 and 180,000 (new ones will cost more than 400,000). Then, I strongly felt that we should give two Christmas gifts to Ko Nyi to buy a tricycle which will help his family tremendously and will be used for years. So I gave two Christmas gifts $(2 \times 90,000 = 180,000)$ to Saya Chit Maung to buy a tricycle for this family. Saya Chit Maung later told me that he and Ko Nyi bought a tricycle (pic below) with 170,000 kyats and the rest (10,000) would be for their immediate use.

I translated Saya Chit Maung's letter in Burmese as follows:

Dear Dr. Neil and Mrs. Diana Sowards and FOB donors,

Merry Christmas to you all.

I chose Ko Nyi's family for the Christmas gift. There are five members in his family including his mother. He worked any available jobs to earn a living for his family. His mother and wife collected bottles along Ayeyarwady River. Sometimes they picked betel nuts and sold them. Since he could not find any other job, Ko Nyi borrowed a tricycle to make money for the family. I chose the family for this reason.

Ko Nyi said that he was very happy and grateful for a Christmas gift of a tricycle for his family. He was very happy to receive it unexpectedly and how much he was grateful is beyond what he could express. He was grateful to you and the donors and prayed that God would bless you more.

My family and I live and work as a missionary in Dala. Here most of the people are not educated and they are very poor. Some people sold water to earn a living. But after the virus and the coup, many people who used to buy water from them could no longer buy it from them. So they are in a very difficult situation.
