HOLY COMMUNION

This meal is weird and wonderful: weird because we actually believe that the bread and wine are the Body and Blood of Jesus the Christ; wonderful because Jesus is with us. We take this meal very seriously here at Grace. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out and allow us to answer your questions. *Children* who have not been instructed in the meaning of the Sacrament may come to the Lord's Table with their parents for a blessing but are asked to fold their arms across their chests to indicate they are to receive a blessing.

THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE COMMUNION: After the closing hymn, Pastor Cris will pronounce the sending and then for those who wish to share in the celebration of communion shall remain. *For those who have an intolerance to wine, grape juice is lighter colored on the tray, center.* Those who find it difficult to walk to the altar can be communed at your seat. Please inform the usher of your need. After Pastor Cris has given your group the blessing at the altar, you may place your cup in the basket and depart from the Sanctuary down the center aisle, and enjoy fellowship in the hall.

Spiritual Conversation - Spreading the Word

Many people have said when spiritual conversations happened previously, it only created tensions and arguments. THE SECOND LESSON Ephesians 6:10-20

The real battles and dangers we face are not just against flesh and blood. Spiritual powers often reveal themselves in institutional evils like genocide, terror, tyranny, and oppression. The weapons needed to combat them, though, are not earthly weapons at all but the armor of God.

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to

withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak.

As believers, we labor together in this world, enduring pain, loss, and unfulfilled desires. Believers can be encouraged that in eternity, all needs will be fulfilled in the presence of God.

But now I am going to him who sent me, and none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your heart. Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. And when he comes, he will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment: concerning sin, because they do not believe in me;

concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father, and you will see me no longer; concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.

"I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. Eye Glasses Needed For Short Term Mission Trip!

- Lois Danzo is going on a short term mission trip to South Africa with MOST Ministries.
- The goal of the trip is to provide vision screenings and eye glasses for those in need.
- A receptacle is provided for your glasses in Church Hall.

Drop off your gently used adult-sized, child-sized, over the counter reading or prescription glasses or your gently used prescription sunglasses.

Lois is a member of a team from St. Luke Lutheran Church, Haslet, MI, who has partnered with MOST Ministries (<u>M</u>ission <u>O</u>pportunities <u>S</u>hort-<u>T</u>erm, a Michigan based non-profit mission sending agency) to take these eyeglasses to Middleburg, South Africa in July 2022.

This year 4 million pairs of eyeglasses will be thrown away in the United States while 158 million people worldwide suffer from uncorrected vision. The cost of a pair of glasses in many developing nations can exceed a month's salary.
