MSCA NEWS & UPDATES

Board Updates

The MSCA Board of Directors met on March 28 & 29 for its regularly scheduled meeting - see below updates. As a reminder, minutes from past meetings may be viewed by <u>clicking here</u>. Below are a few notable highlights of the Board's work this weekend:

- The Board of Directors approved the proposed budget for the 2025-2026 fiscal year.
- The Membership Linkage Committee headed by Assistant Board Chair- Carey Hughes has been established. This board committee has been tasked with developing focus questions for members to help gain insight and feedback into the needs and ways in which MSCA can support members throughout the state of Missouri. More information will be shared as to how you can participate in these focus groups.
- Jill Hancock, Director of Operations, Cindy Bentley and Sarah Kaelin, MSCA Board members, attended a regional leadership development conference recently in Chicago, Illinois. This group was able to participate in various breakout sessions to help network and brainstorm ideas for MSCA. Their participation in this professional development has provided some

- insight into ways we can strengthen our MSCA Leadership Development and Delegate Assembly.
- The Board of Directors established a committee to take a look at our MSCA Ends Policies and compare them to the toolkit provided by ASCA. Based on this work, the committee looked for feedback from the rest of the Board of Directors. These Ends Policies will be reviewed and changes voted on in September. Any changes to the Ends Policies has to be voted on by the delegates during the Delegate Assembly in November.
- The Ends Policy E.1, School counselors are educated about, and advocate for, state and national legislation related to school counseling and education issues, was monitored. Discussion was had about the importance of continued offering of advocacy efforts to support school counselors throughout the state of Missouri. There was an increase in participation in the Advocacy Day at the Capitol!
- During this meeting, a new board chair and assistant chair were voted on. Congratulations to Olivia Carter who will be serving as Board Chair and Cindy Bentley who will be the Assistant Chair. Their roles begin on October 1st.
- Before the end of the school year, MSCA Board of Directors would like to check in with Regional Leadership. Region Presidents- please be on the lookout for opportunities to chat with the MSCA Board sometime in May!

Legislative Update

MSCA members are invited to participate in <u>monthly legislative update virtual discussions</u> (3rd Friday of each month during the legislative session). Here is what has been going on in the capitol:

- Missouri legislators returned to the Capitol from their annual spring break, focusing on legislative priorities.
- The House Budget Committee finalized their version of the FY26 Budget.

- The House debated bills on school safety, initiative and referendum petitions, settlement demands, workers' compensation, license fee offices, telehealth services, professional registration, emergency suspensions, dental care in correctional centers, and state preemption of licensed professions.
- Additional bills in the House addressed licensure of speech pathologists and audiologists, SAPA 2.0, employment security, property assessments, emergency medical services, design-build projects, teacher externships, and consolidated public library districts.
- Further House discussions included payments of real and personal property taxes, coroners, kratom products, civil jurisprudence, financial institutions, motor vehicles, utility reimbursement, drug trafficking, and pensions.
- The House also addressed sales tax exemptions on auctioned property, private pension taxation, sunshine law, confiscation of animals, and local election authority prohibitions.
- Several House committee meetings were held to discuss bills related to the Patients First Act, therapeutic water projects, and a post-consumer paint recycling program.
- The Senate perfected SB 79, allowing the Farm Bureau to offer less comprehensive and potentially less expensive health plans to its members, after debate and compromise.
