What's Fair?	K-5	This lesson helps students explore the difference between being fair and unfair and how being fair helps everyone get along.
Trading Cards That Honor True Greatness	k-5	Each year in my elementary art classroom, students learn about a diverse group of black men and women in honor of Black History Month (this activity, though, is relevant throughout the year)
What are Gender Stereotypes?	K-5	In this lesson, students will think about characteristics they ascribe to either boys or girls. They will learn about the idea of “stereotypes” and will consider whether gender stereotypes are fair or unfair. They will also discuss how it feels to not conform to socially defined gender norms.
Analyzing Gender Stereotypes in Media	K-5	This lesson helps students analyze and critique messages about gender that they get from various media. Students will focus on toys and toy advertisements, challenging themselves to think past what advertisements tell them about their gender identity.
Gender Bias and Homophobia in Sports	3-5	This lesson discusses common characteristics and stereotypes that are associated with athletes.
Ruth Bader Ginsburg: Understanding and Empathy	3-12	Overview: Ruth Bader Ginsburg was a well-respected Supreme Court Justice who stood firmly in her belief that women should be treated equally. How can you make just decisions by listening with understanding and empathy? (Will need to create an account in Thrively to be able to access)



Malala Yousafzai: Finding Humor	9-12	Overview: Shot in the face by Taliban at just 15 years old, Malala Yousafazi is the picture of perseverance. Dedicated to the fight for educational rights for all, Malala's story has inspired great work and won her a Nobel Peace Prize. What can we learn about finding humor even in the darkest of times? (Will need to create an account in Thrively to be able to access)
