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ABSTRACT

Abstract should be written in English. The abstract is written with Times New Roman font size 10, and single spacing. The abstract should be clear, concise, and descriptive. The abstract should summarize the content of the paper, including a brief introduction to the **problems, the aim of the research**, followed by a statement regarding the **methodology** and a brief summary of **results**. The abstract should end with a comment on the significance of the results or a brief **conclusion**. It should not contain any references or displayed equations. The abstract should be no more than 250 words. (10 pt)

Keywords: *up to 3 keywords in English* (10 pt, italics)

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INTRODUCTION (Times New Roman, 12 pt, Bold, UPPERCASE)

This template is used as a guideline for writing article in Sanitas: Journal of Health Technology and Arts, published by Poltekkes Kemenkes Jakarta II. Articles are written in English using Times New Roman font type, size 12, 1.5 spacing, justified left and right, margin 3 cm, using Letter size paper (210 mm x 279 mm). The length of Manuscript is approximately 5-10 pages, including pictures and tables.

The introduction contains the urgency and background of the research problem which is described using the inverted pyramid method starting from the global, national and local levels. The introductory section includes: background, research problems or research questions, state of the art, and research objectives. Reference sources come from primary sources (journals) published in the last 10 years (75% of references) which can justify the novelty or uniqueness of this research compared to previous research. If there any direct quotation of more than 3 lines, written using 1 space with indent left-right. For citation sources please use round brackets (.....). The final part of the introduction must state the purpose of the research. The manuscript will be checked for plagiarism using the TURNITIN software before the journal undergo a review. The result of checking plagiarism through the TURNITIN software is a maximum of 20%.

MATERIAL & METHODS (Times New Roman, 12 pt, Bold, UPPERCASE)

The research method at least describes the approach of study, the population and research sample, explains the operational definitions of variables along with data measurement tools or methods for collecting data, and data analysis methods. This section describes the types of research including quantitative or qualitative research types, qualitative research such as case studies, phenomenology, ethnography, etc. It is necessary to add a description regarding checking the validity of the research results. Quantitative research describes the location and time of research, population and sample, sampling techniques, data collection techniques, data analysis, and data presentation. Research that uses tools and materials, needs to write down the specifications of the tools and materials used. If the data measurement tool uses a questionnaire, it is necessary to include the results of the validity

and reliability test of the research instrument. Research using human or animals should provide ethical approval from ethic committee.

RESULT & DISCUSSION (Times New Roman, 12 pt, Bold, UPPERCASE)

To presenting findings in this section authors may use any of these formats: 1) the discussion is separate from the results or 2) the discussion is integrated with the presentation of the results. The results of the research must be the answers regarding the problems and research objectives stated previously in the introduction section. The results describe the characteristics of the research subjects, univariate analysis, bivariate analysis and multivariate analysis (if any). The results obtained from research must be supported by adequate data. The result is a summary of data analysis, not the raw data. The results of data analysis from statistical data processing software are presented by retyping them in a table that is tailored to your needs, not by copying the output of the analysis results from the software. The discussion contains reasons that explain the results of research and other studies that support and are not in line with the research results obtained. Presentation of tables and figures must be in accordance with the journal enclosure, tables do not use vertical lines. An example of presenting data in tabular form is shown in Table 1 without using vertical lines.




Figure 1. Respiratory Tracts (source)

CONCLUSION (Times New Roman, 12 pt, Bold, UPPERCASE)

Conclusion is a brief summary of findings and discussion. It is strongly recommended to avoid mere repetitive statements or statistical results from the previous sections. Suggestions may be given for further development and research. Conclusions and suggestions must be in the form of a narrative and may not use bullets or numbers.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT (Times New Roman, 12 pt, Bold, UPPERCASE)

If necessary put your acknowledgements here. In this section you may give credit to people who have helped you with the research or with writing the paper. You also may give credit If your work has been supported by a grant.

REFERENCE (Times New Roman, 12 pt, Bold, UPPERCASE)

The REFERENCE is written according to the Vancouver writing rules. Include only used and relevant literature. To maintain consistency in the way of referring, citing and writing bibliography we recommend using standard reference applications such as Endnote, Mendeley, Zotero, RefWorks or Colwiz.
