

Summary

Pastor Nithin kicks off a new series called 'Ignition' focused on evangelism and being on mission with Jesus. He addresses the congregation's concerns about a spiritual incident from the previous week, then shifts to the main message about how all followers of Jesus are called to be missionaries, not just some. Using Acts 1:4-9 as the foundation, he explains that Jesus calls us to be His witnesses in Jerusalem (our local community), Judea and Samaria (cross-cultural areas), and to the ends of the earth (global missions). The pastor emphasizes that evangelism isn't about being pushy or awkward but about sharing the love and transformation Jesus has brought to our lives with those around us.

Intro Prayer

Heavenly Father, as we gather together today to discuss Your word and Your calling on our lives, we ask that You would open our hearts and minds to what You want to teach us. Help us to set aside our own thoughts, biases, and distractions so that we can fully receive what You have for us in this time together. Holy Spirit, speak to us and show us how we can better live out our calling to be on mission with Jesus. We surrender this time to You and ask that You would use it to transform us. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Ice Breaker

If you could have any superpower for just one day, what would it be and how would you use it to help others?

Questions

- Pastor Nithin mentioned that there are no 'ordinaries' when it comes to following Jesus - we're all called to be missionaries. How does this challenge or encourage you in your faith journey?
- Looking at the four circles of mission (Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, ends of the earth), which area feels most natural to you and which feels most challenging? Why?
- What are some barriers or fears that hold you back from sharing your faith with friends, family, or coworkers?
- The pastor shared a story about praying for someone at the gym. Can you think of a time when God prompted you to step out of your comfort zone to show His love to someone?
- How can we balance showing God's love through our actions while also being willing to use words to share the gospel?
- Who comes to mind when you think about your 'Francis list' (friends, relatives, acquaintances, neighbors, coworkers, enemies, strangers)?
- What does it mean to you personally to say 'Here I am, send me' in your current life circumstances?
- How can our small group support and encourage each other in being more intentional about sharing our faith?

Life Application

This week, create your own Francis list by writing down the names of people in your life who don't know Jesus. Choose one person from that list and commit to praying for them daily. Look for one practical way to show God's love to that person this week, whether through a kind gesture, a listening ear, or simply spending time with them. Before you leave your house each day, pray 'Here I am, Lord, send me' and ask God to make you available to be His witness wherever you go.

Key Takeaways
