What challenges have you overcome as an organization and what have you learned from these?
2	Is your organization youth-led? This means that the majority of your leadership is under 35 (this includes your board if you have one) Yes No
3	Is your organization youth-focused? This means that your group or organization's main beneficiaries are young people and children under the age of 35. Yes No
