You've got a serger, YAY! Now come and learn all the features your serger has to offer. They can be intimidating at first, but once you've completed the New Owner Class you'll have a handle on threading, changing stitches, using differential feed, and so much more. We will go through the Serger Mastery book and make samples of each stitch along with making use of various settings. Once you've completed this class you'll be well on your way to finding ways to use your serger!

• Thread - Bring one serger thread cone of red, blue, green, and yellow. There are kits available at Loving Stitches for purchase. Most serger manuals use these colors to identify the different thread paths used in a serger. Learning with these colors will allow you to identify which thread needs adjusting to achieve proper stitch formation, and to identify what happens when settings are adjusted for different stitches.
