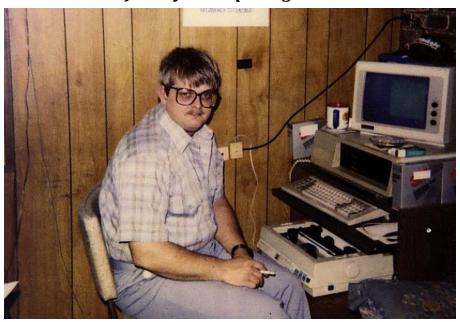

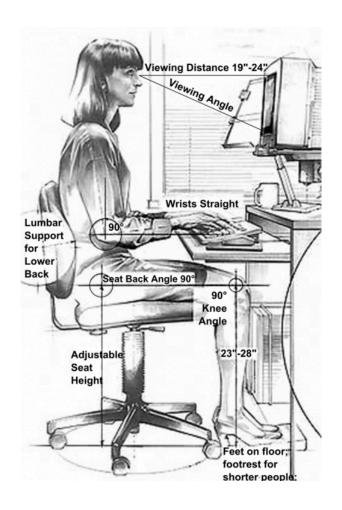

- 3. Just let Johnny make all of your decisions moving forward

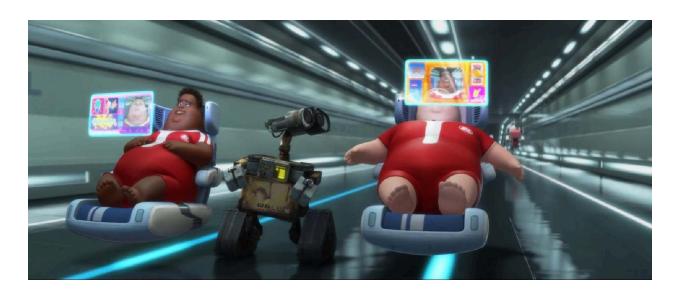


#### What Is the Goal?

If the set up is good then I believe that:

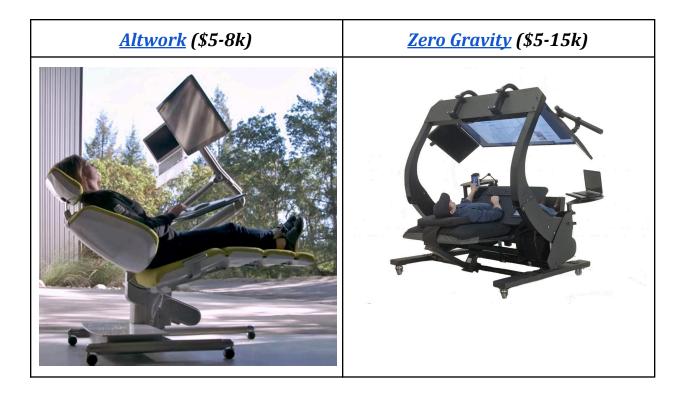
You should be perfectly comfortable sitting in it for 12 hours at a time without any soreness or achiness of any kind.

## **Elements of a Successful Office Chair Setup**

#### 1. Desk

- a. Lets your feet stick out the end
- b. Far enough away from the wall so your legs/feet can fully stretch out
- c. At the right height so your arms/hands are at a comfortable angle related to the mouse and keyboard
  - i. You don't want to feel the weight of your wrists on the edge of your desk
- d. Enough space to hold 2x monitors and accessories

#### 2. Chair

- a. Padding
  - i. Heavy and thick so you're comfortable all day
  - ii. High quality that won't flatten out over time
- b. Lean
  - i. Leans back at the correct angle
  - ii. Stays leaning back
- c. Back
  - i. Tall, executive style back
  - ii. Neck support
  - iii. Your head should be at the correct angle to be comfortable without holding it up
  - iv. Angle between seat and back is comfortable not perfectly vertical
    - 1. This angle is fixed the whole thing should tilt, not just the back
  - v. Your eyes should be at the right level so they naturally fall around 1/2 to 2/3 up the screen
- d. Seat
  - i. Wide enough so you can rotate to your side easily
- e. Padded arms

#### f. Wheeled base

i. Wide enough to support your weight fully reclined

#### 3. Ottoman

- a. Big enough so your legs can be in multiple configurations without slipping off
- b. Enough padding so that your calves never get tired/sore

#### 4. Floor

a. Must be able to move the chair around easily without having to constantly reposition yourself

#### **Tips**

#### You're Probably Gonna Have to Try It in Person

You won't know how it actually feels and if the mechanism will work for you, until you sit in it.

#### Stores

If you can, buy from Costco or Sam's Club. The price will be cheaper and you can return it easily.

#### Shipping from the US

Shipping an office chair overseas is gonna be expensive, but it might end up being the least bad option. You can see what it might cost and then make a decision.

#### For Thick Padding

Look for the phrasing "big and tall"

#### There is a knob to adjust the return spring strength

If you lean back in the chair and it keeps kicking you forward, then try adjusting the knob to loosen the spring strength

## You Might Have to Mix and Match

That's what I had to do. Fortunately, many office chairs use the same basic hardware setup, so it was easy to do. As long as it uses a 4 bolt tile mechanism setup, there is a very high likelihood that the different parts will fit.

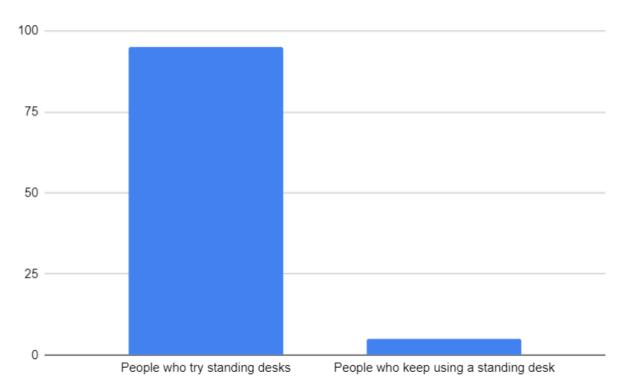
#### **Leather or Cloth**

There are trade-offs with each, so you'll have to make a personal choice. I would personally prefer cloth to leather but all that was available to me that met my criteria was leather, so that's what I went with. You do you, though.

- 1. Leather is more durable on average
- 2. Leather is Easier to clean

- 3. Leather is cool to the touch, which isn't fun in the winter (this is why I prefer cloth)
- 4. Can get a little sticky if you sweat

## **Standing/Treadmill Desks?**



If you need to discover for yourself that you're in the first group, then here is the deal:

- 1. Spend your own money on it
- 2. If you actually are still using it after 3 months, I will reimburse you for it
  - a. Within reason as there are some very expensive setups out there that I am not interested in spending company resources on

I am willing to bet basically any amount of money that you won't actually like it enough to do it long-term. I have known several people who reported that they felt great using a standing desk initially, but without failure, every single one of them was back at a sitting desk within 2 weeks.

The spirit is willing but the flesh is weak.

## Do I Really Have to Set My Office Up This Way?

No, definitely not.

I obviously recommend a solution like this but everyone has a different body and preferences, and even though my preferences are clearly superior, I want you to do what feels right to you.

The point of this SOP is to offer the best solution that I have found for me. Of course, if you follow this SOP and you're happy as a Johnny in his custom recliner next to his YooHoo fridge, then make sure to Like, Comment, Subscribe and hit that Notification bell.
