24 Hour Charity Shoot Aiming to Shoot 100,000 Points

Event Information:	University of Bristol Archery is taking part in the BRIT Challenge to raise funds to support and improve young adult, student and staff mental health, fitness and wellbeing throughout the UK. With the support of University of Bristol Sport Exercise and Health, we have the opportunity to shoot in our usual training venue for 24 hours continuously. Last year we set ourselves the goal of shooting over 24,000 points in 24 hours, and shot 76,400 points, raising £807. This year we aim to score 100,000 points in 24 hours, shooting continuously from 13:00 on Saturday 5th April to 13:00 on Sunday 6th April. We will mainly be shooting the popular Portsmouth round, however some archers will be shooting a variety of indoor rounds. We hope participation in the challenge will help to destigmatise mental health and champion equality, diversity and inclusion. Timings:	Continuous shooting from 13:00 to 13:00. Give it a Go (GIAG) Session for University of Bristol (UoB) Students 14:00 to 15:30 on 5th April. External archers may shoot from 08:00 to 13:00 on 6th April only.
Shooting Format:	Your choice of indoor round, shot in a single detail with 6 arrow ends.
Give it a Go:	Current University of Bristol students can come and try archery from 14:00 to 15:30 on 5th April. This will be the last GIAG session run this academic year. Please note that as both beginners courses for this academic year have passed, beginners will not be able to join the club until next September. External Archers:	To help reach this goal we invite any archer who is a member of Archery GB to shoot with us, in exchange for a donation. Due to constraints on range size and venue staffing, this is only possible from 08:00 to 13:00 on Sunday 6th of April. We suggest
