November 2022 "Arts Team" Newsletter

Art

<u>Pre-K</u>- Students create images and forms from observation, memory and imagination. They investigate a variety of ways that artists develop ideas and organize the elements of art in responding to what they see, know, and feel.

<u>Kindergarten</u>-Students describe the elements of art that artists use to express ideas and use line, shape, color, and pattern to express their own ideas. Students identify the materials and tools that artists use to create artwork. The fundamental learning this month will enable students to create artworks that represent observed forms and explore the use of shapes and forms to express ideas.



1st Grade- Students will continue working with lines, shapes, textures, and patterns by using them to represent observed physical qualities of people, animals, and objects. Students will identify ways that artists represent what they see, know, feel, and imagine and have opportunities to create sketches to develop ideas.

2nd Grade- Students categorize and compare themes in artwork and create thematic images. Students focus on the use of shape and balance to represent ideas visually.

<u>3rd Grade</u>- Students focus on artistic choices needed to create artwork. This provides students with opportunities to evaluate their options to achieve a desired result. Students analyze and experiment with composition, including balance and emphasis.

<u>4th Grade</u>- Students analyze an artist's expression of personal meaning and techniques for creating artwork. This provides students with opportunities to develop solutions to visual problems in new ways. Students express personal meaning through point of view and mood. They will establish and use criteria for judging artwork.

<u>5th Grade</u>- Students explore how artists develop ideas and depict human experience. This provides students with opportunities to express their thoughts and feelings about human experience. Students analyze how artists develop ideas and experiment with media, processes and techniques to express thoughts and feelings. Students will also compare the aesthetic qualities of artworks using art vocabulary.
