## **Introduction (14 pt, Bold)**

*(Garamond, 12 pt, Single Spacing)*

The introduction should position the study within a broader scholarly and socio-intellectual context by moving systematically from general discussion to specific research problems. Authors are expected to begin with a clear explanation of the broader research context, including relevant global or contemporary issues, empirical realities, and the significance of the topic within Qur'anic legal studies and related disciplines. The introduction must then identify the specific research problem addressed in the study. Authors should clearly explain the central issue, theoretical tension, interpretive debate, methodological limitation, or unresolved scholarly problem that motivates the research.

Authors are required to provide a concise but critical review of previous studies to position the article within existing scholarship. The literature review should not merely list prior studies individually, but should synthesize and group major scholarly trends, approaches, debates, or methodological orientations relevant to the topic. A clear and explicit research gap must be identified as the primary justification for the study. The gap may be conceptual, methodological, empirical, interpretive, or contextual. Authors should explicitly explain what remains insufficiently explored in previous scholarship and how the present study addresses that limitation. The introduction must also clearly formulate the research questions and research objectives. Authors are encouraged to present two or three focused research questions that directly correspond to the identified problem and research gap.

A concise theoretical framework should be introduced to explain the principal theories, concepts, or analytical perspectives employed in the study. Authors should briefly clarify how the selected framework supports the interpretation and analysis of the research problem. The introduction should conclude with a concise statement explaining the importance of the study, highlighting its academic significance, theoretical contribution, and novelty. The originality or distinctive contribution of the study must be stated explicitly as the principal scholarly value of the article.

## **Method (14 pt, Bold)**

The method section must provide sufficient detail to allow the study to be understood and academically evaluated. Authors should clearly describe the research design, whether qualitative, quantitative, or mixed methods, as well as the data sources or participants involved in the study. The section should explain the techniques used for data collection, the analytical framework or interpretation method employed, and the overall research procedures. Any modifications to established methods must be clearly justified. Authors are expected to demonstrate methodological transparency and ensure that the selected method is appropriate for addressing the research objectives.

## **Results and Discussion (14 pt, Bold)**

The Results and Discussion section constitutes the analytical core of the article and must be organized systematically in each sub-section. Authors are encouraged to begin each discussion with a clear topic sentence presenting the principal argument, finding, or interpretive claim rather than general introductory statements. Findings must then be supported by specific data, textual evidence, empirical results, or documented sources accompanied by appropriate citations or body notes. The presented findings should not remain descriptive but must be analytically interpreted using the theoretical framework, concepts, or analytical perspectives introduced earlier in the article. Authors are expected to critically engage with previous studies by comparing, contrasting, or

contextualizing their findings within broader scholarly discussions so that the analysis develops dialogically rather than standing independently. The discussion must clearly demonstrate whether the findings support, refine, expand, or challenge existing theories and previous scholarship. Authors should also explain the broader theoretical implications of the findings and clarify their academic significance within Qur'anic legal studies and related disciplines. Each sub-section should conclude with a concise concluding statement that reinforces the principal analytical point developed in the discussion.

### **Conclusion (14 pt, Bold)**

The conclusion must provide concise and direct answers to the research objectives and synthesize the principal findings into a coherent academic argument. Authors should highlight the theoretical contribution, academic significance, broader implications of the study, and possible directions for future research. The conclusion must not merely repeat the abstract or restate descriptive findings and should not introduce new arguments or additional data.

Authors are strongly encouraged to use reference management software such as Mendeley or Zotero to ensure consistency and accuracy in citation formatting.
