Southwestern Maine Activities Association Athletic Administrators' Meeting

Friday, October 27, 2023, 11:00 A.M Remote – Google Meet

Meeting Called to order by President Curtis at 11:02 AM.

Members Present: Biddeford, Bonny Eagle, Cheverus, Deering, Falmouth, Gorham, Kennebunk, Marshwood, Massabesic, Noble, Portland, Sanford, Scarborough, South Portland, Thornton Academy, Westbrook and Windham.

There was a lengthy discussion of the Mass Shooting tragedy in Lewiston on Wednesday, October 25th.

A survey of each Association school was conducted regarding the impact to their game and practice plans.

Sixteen of the Association schools have no plans for any activities on Friday or Saturday.

Association schools are hoping the situation is resolved and schools can reopen on Monday.

The Cumberland County Superintendents will meet today via Zoom to discuss the ongoing challenges presented by the mass shooting.

There was a lengthy review of potential alterations to the MPA Playoff schedule.

Mr. Hoyt provided an outline of MPA Playoff alternatives being considered. The MPA will issue a guidance document today regarding all Fall Playoff schedules. **The MPA further recommends to NOT play any games on Friday and Saturday.**

Lance Johnson reported on the special MPA Football Committee Meeting of Thursday October 26th.

The MPA memo was received and reviewed by schools as the meeting progressed.

The MPA was contacted to verify/correct one date in the memo.

There was a lengthy discussion of the best practices time required between football games for safe competition.

There was agreement that the SMAA would set football game time slots if needed on a Saturday to accommodate the playing of games. (for example, 11 AM, 2:30 PM and 5:30 PM)

Motion: The SMAA will not play or compete in games, competitions or other events on Friday, Saturday and Monday (October 27-30). SMAA Association members will return to competitive activities on Tuesday October 31, 2023, provided the public safety conditions allow such mass gathering activities.
