6:00 - 6:10	Budget Overview	<p>State of The District</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Michael reminded us that many district departments serve schools directly (e.g. language learning teachers, custodians, para educators for SPED) - Schools no longer pay for guest teachers; this is funded by the district - Cabinet-level teams are currently making their reductions. Notifications will happen Nov/Dec - Jan/Feb/Mar will be when schools notify reduced staff. Michael is hoping to having all notifications out by January for Shelton staff. - Staff, OLT, community survey, SCC will all contribute feedback - District is predicting us at 347 in 26/27 - FRL decreased from 38% to 34% → we owe \$50k to district because of this decrease - Enrollment loss + 1.5 to 4.5% reduction (out of a \$3M budget) (\$80,000 to \$150,000 range) - We have one retirement - Dec survey from Shelton to Shelton community - Jan 14: We will receive our budget reduction and budget - Capping choice enrollment would mean, long term, two classes per grade level <p>Projected Budget Implications at Shelton</p>

Philip suggested prioritizing maintaining specials due to the nuanced nature of those roles and difficulty finding those staff members

There are some schools that have halftime AMP teachers, but the students still get a full AMP load because the teachers are at two schools

Katie asked if the district has considered redrawing school boundaries. District is conducting a boundary study

Kim shared her perspective that the cuts should happen as far away from kids as possible

Philip shared that if there need to be technology cuts, let's cut them from lower grades. Kim shared that this was discussed at the EdTech advisory meeting and different scenarios were proposed. Also some cutting of digital tools discussed. Kim shared that the committee analyzed the usage of different tools

Michael mentioned that OLT has discussed if we need to be thinking about 2 kinder, 2 first, 2 second.

Philip shared that we should share volunteer roles widely ahead of cuts.
