

## Who Is Alexandra Fasulo?

- She is not a farmer, scientist, or environmental professional. She is a social media influencer who has cycled through multiple online personas, including freelance writing guru, lifestyle influencer, and now land preservation activist.
- She previously claimed to earn \$378K+/year as a Fiverr freelance writer and sold courses based on those claims. Fellow freelancers and journalists raised serious questions about the veracity of her income claims and methods.

### **Her Goal Is Stopping Clean Energy, Not Improving It**

- She has called renewable energy a "green delusion" and described solar and wind as "a joke of an energy source."

- She frames New York's clean energy targets as a government conspiracy to "destroy our land" rather than engaging constructively with siting or policy.
- Her most recent Substack post explicitly frames the sunset of federal clean energy tax credits as a positive development and cheers the prospect of projects losing funding.

- She has never proposed alternative pathways to meeting clean energy goals, only obstruction.

### **Clean Energy Benefits Western New York**

- Wind and solar projects bring construction and operations jobs, generate local tax revenue for schools and municipal services through PILOT agreements, and reduce regional dependence on volatile fossil fuel markets.
- At a time when energy affordability and energy security are top concerns for families across the region, homegrown wind and solar reduce exposure to global fuel price swings.
- Blocking these projects does not preserve the status quo — it keeps communities dependent on imported fossil fuels and forfeits economic development opportunities to other regions.
- All wind and solar projects are subject to state and federal oversight, including wildlife monitoring protocols developed with the DEC.
