Course Description: A course designed to enable the student to recognize and avoid hazards within his/her environment; to intelligently assist in case of accident or illness; to develop skills necessary for immediate and temporary care of a victim. First Aid and CPR Certification will be offered. (ACC Catalog/prerequisites: none/Skills: Reading)

Text/Materials: *Responding to Emergencies; American Red Cross* (for edition see instructor's syllabus.)

Additional materials will be listed on each instructor's syllabus

Instructional Methodology: This class is an interactive lecture or HYD class.

Interactive lecture course – students will learn through lecture, text, course notes as well as application of materials covered throughout the course.

Hybrid Courses (HYD) — Students complete most coursework online (more than 50%) with at least one mandatory on-campus component: a classroom meeting, lab work, on-site orientation, testing in an ACC Testing Center. Students need to be aware of the on-campus requirement when registering.

Course Rationale: The purpose of this course is to learn the specific skills and/or the techniques as well as the rationale of first aid to include CPR w/AED.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students will perform CPR, AED and first aid according to American Red Cross Responding to Emergency standards.

Departmental Objectives:

1. To learn the rules, fundamentals, skills and strategies of first aid, safety and CPR.
2. To learn how to correctly execute required skills and techniques as well as to use the equipment/facilities safely.
3. To understand how Kinesiology relates to a healthy individual lifestyle.

Course Objectives:

1. To learn the skills necessary to both properly assess and assist victims experiencing life threatening and non-life threatening medical situations.
2. To practice the CPR skills on mannequins.
3. To perform bandaging and other first aid skills effectively.
4. To successfully complete course material and be certified by the American Red Cross: Responding to Emergencies, Adult, Child, and Infant CPR and first-aid.
