Forged in the changing realities and needs of the February 24, 2022 Russian invasion of Ukraine, Red Kalyna is the musical creation of two US-Ukrainian and two US-Italian co-nationals, residing in Caswell and Alamance Counties North Carolina. Galyna Karpenski, Yanceyville, NC, and Iryna Tkachenko, Haw River, NC, were originally from Ukraine. Peggy Boswell & Loreins Vellani, Mebane, NC, reclaimed their Italian citizenship more than a decade ago through Loreins' family. Ukrainian national, Misha Shvets of Chapel Hill, NC, joined the ensemble in January 2023.

The members perform under the name Red Kalyna, a species of berry-producing tree (Viburnum opolus) native throughout North Africa and Europe, and a foundational element of Ukrainian national identify and culture. Iryna & Misha's love of Ukrainian music & culture is authentic & instinctual. As citizens of a founding European Union (EU) member nation, Peggy & Loreins realize that war in any nation bordering the EU is of critical concern to all people in Europe, as well as for peace on the planet. Sometimes joining these musicians is Greensboro's David Thompson, the spouse of a Ukrainian-American.

David, Iryna, Loreins & Peggy are also active members of the regionally-renowned, Alamance County-based ensemble Mebanesville.
