## **Romeo and Juliet Discussions**

Begin by responding to items 1 or 2 below. Your next 3 posts can either be responses to what another student has posted or responses to items 3 - 5. Each student should post at least 4 times for each discussion. A discussion follows each scene in this play--24 total.

Your first of the four posts is the most important, so put some thought into what you say. These posts will be a big help to everyone as we begin putting together ideas for our three paper topics.

- 1. Share any passage you marked because it related to one of our three themes. Always type the passage, citing it using MLA style (I.ii.23-25)\*. Be sure to explain how the passage is linked to the theme. (Love, culpability, or fate.)
- Share any passage you find that might be used to support an opinion about one of the prompt questions. Always explain how you might use the passage in your essay.
- 3. Share any confusion you have about the meaning of lines, the motivation of characters, or the movement of the plot.

- 5. Share any other insights you have about what's going on in the play.
- 6. Share any good links you find relevant to the content of the scene. (Note: This is likely to make your teacher especially happy.)

\*To cite Shakespeare using the MLA style guide, you must know your Roman numerals from 1 - 5. Here they are:

Capitals = I, II, III, IV, V

Non-captials = i, ii, iii, iv, v

The numbers you use will correspond to the act, scene and line numbers in the play.
