Introduction

Exploration High School (ExHS), located in Northeast Minneapolis, is a public charter school that opened in September 2021 with ninth and tenth grade, serving 49 students in its first year. ExHS is expanding to grade 11 in 2022-23 and grade 12 in 2023-24 to fully be a 9-12 high school. The school offers an innovative project-based curriculum that emphasizes community problem solving and field experiences.

- 67.3% of our students, on average, qualified for free or reduced-price meals.
- Based on end of year state reporting, 63.3% of our students identified as Hispanic, BIPOC, or two or more races
- 24.4% of students qualified for SPED services
- Majority of students reside in Northeast Minneapolis, North Minneapolis, Robbinsdale, Crystal, and New Hope

Student Attrition

Over the course of the school year, 4 students transferred out of and 5 students transferred into Exploration High School. Of students enrolled at the end of the school year, 3 did not return for the current year.

9th through 11th grade students that were in attendance from September to May the previous year will return to EHS the following school year. ExHS has a superb student return rate after their first year of operation. 96% of students completing the FY22 school year returned in FY23.

Innovative Practices

We at Exploration are continually looking to adapt our practices to the unique needs and gifts of our students. This translates into a lot of student agency, personalized experiences, project-based learning, community asset learning, restorative practices, experiential learning, and collaborative teaching. Below are examples that transpired during the 2021-2022 school year that demonstrate these practices:

- Switch to Interdisciplinary Co-teaching model
 - Midway through the year, after listening to what our students were saying about their core subject classes, we decided to make a shift which resulted

in pairing core subjects teachers together. This led to much more fluid interdisciplinary learning that both students and teachers responded well to. Here's additional information on the <u>community garden build</u>.

- End-of-year Community Asset Project with Public Exhibition
 - These projects are designed to help students connect their passions to needs within our community and beyond. Each student has worked on identifying a problem in their community and designed a workable solution. Here is <u>June's Exhibition</u>.

• Field Experiences

- Being a "public school for public good," our students know that learning happens beyond the walls of our school building. Despite limitations with budget and transportation, our students got to have field experiences such as outdoor education at Camp Fire MN including an overnight camping experience, Minneapolis Institute of Art, Gold Medal Flour Museum, College Fair at Twins Stadium, Friends of the Mississippi River, and Appetite for Change.
- Our teachers had a very special field experience in the spring of 2022. We earmarked funds from our Charter School Program grant for each of our teachers to travel to a national exemplar school and learn from it. Schools included XQ Super Schools Iowa Big (Grand Rapids, IA), Crosstown High (Memphis, TN), and New Harmony High School (New Orleans, LA). Teachers produced a report by the end of the school year that they delivered to peers, informing what innovative practices they observed, sparking conversation for how we want to put our Exploration twist on things.

Academic Performance

Below are our authorizer goals, tied to academic performance. Majority of our first and second operational years will be gathering baseline data.

- 1. Students continually enrolled for 2 years will earn "meets expectations" or "exceeds expectations" on the MCA Reading assessment in FY23; beginning in FY24, students will meet or exceed expectations on the MCA Reading and Math assessments
 - We don't have the data yet as this was our first operational year.

- 2. 100% of enrolled students will take the College and Career Readiness Assessment (CCRA+) annually. Beginning with FY 2023, a minimum of 80% of students will see an increase in their critical thinking subscore, which is an academic growth-related indicator. The first year the CCRA+ is administered (fall of 2022 FY23) will establish students' baseline score. Please note an update in the name of this assessment.
 - We don't have the data yet as this was our first operational year.
- 3. ExHS graduates will complete all components of the Community Asset Projects ("CAPS") program, as measured by the CAP Rubric.
 - 100% of our students end last academic year with completing a successful Community Asset Project, showcased at our Public Exhibition of Learning.
- 4. ExHS graduates will have earned credit for at least one post-secondary course or an equivalent in trade certifications.
 - We started planning for work-based learning opportunities in eleventh grade when all students will earn this credit.

Staffing

In the 2020-21 school year, ExHS employed 5 FTE licensed teachers to serve 49 students in grade 9 and 10. This included 1 special education teacher. Our student to staff ratio was 7:1.

Teacher Retention

ExHS retained 100% of teachers for the 2022-23 school year.

ExHS will expand to 11th grade in 2022-23 and 12th grade in 2023-24, thus being a complete 9-12 secondary school. Our enrollment target is 75 students in 2022-23 and 105 students in 2023-24. We have plans to continue growing and move into a new facility in the coming years that will meet our growing needs.
