

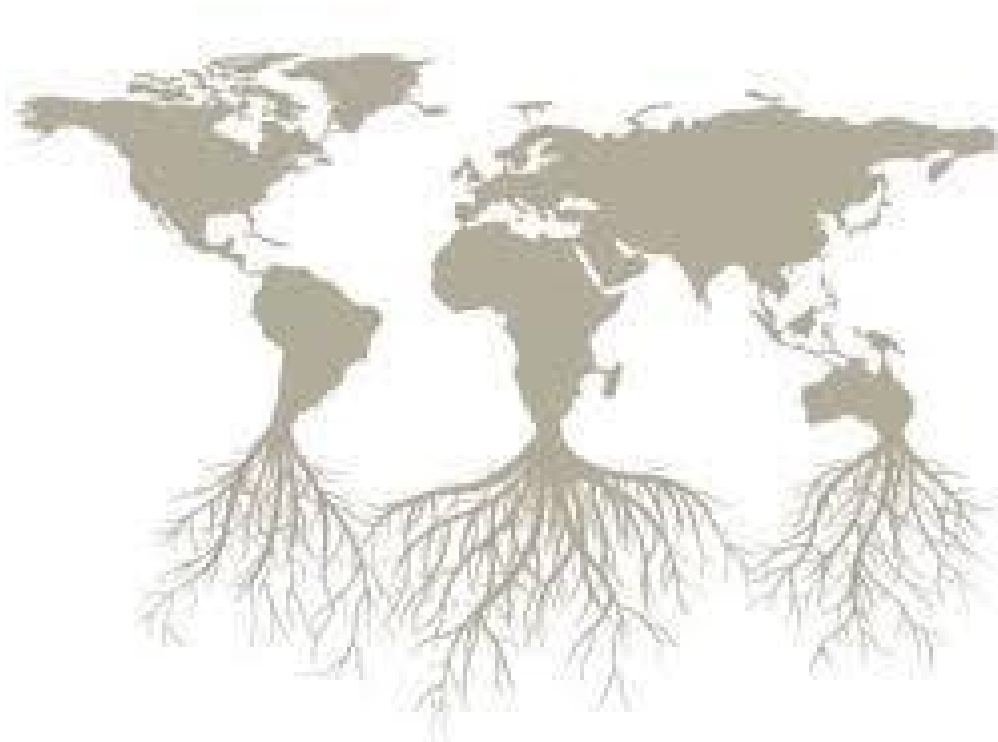

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## **Introduction**

**This Eco-Social Engagement Report (ESER) indicates the wide range of environmental sustainability and justice activities at the 28 North American Jesuit colleges and universities. Members of the Laudato Sí Commission of the Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities (AJCU) assembled this data in preparation for the 2024 Faith, Justice, and Reconciliation Assembly.**

**At the end of his October 4, 2023, Apostolic Exhortation *Laudate Deum*, Pope Francis pointedly identified United States citizens' "irresponsible lifestyle" as a significant factor in global environmental degradation. Taking this bracing remark to heart, the Laudato Sí Commission questioned whether North American Jesuit college and university operations, academics, campus life, and civic engagements aim sufficiently at challenging this lifestyle and stirring student desires to heal our broken world.**

**Data was required to answer this question. What are the 28 North American colleges and universities doing in response to the challenges of environmental sustainability and justice? The ESER offers answers that individual institutions and the AJCU can build on.**

**The next section explains the data-gathering process, the data categories, and how the data can be used. An executive summary follows. The heart of this report is the data itself, presented alphabetically from one institution to the next. The report concludes with two appendices: one aligning the ESER data with the with the Sustainability Tracking Assessment & Rating System (STARS) and another aligning the ESER with the 7 goals of Pope Francis' Laudato Si Action Platform/7-Year Journey Project.**

**The Laudato Sí Commission hopes the work started here can be continued and that an ongoing record of North American Jesuit college and university eco-social activities will be maintained.**

### **Data Collection, Organization, and Use**

**The Commission sent the first request for eco-social activities data to AJCU college and university representatives in July 2023. Three**

**subsequent rounds of additions and edits followed through May 2024. Finding the proper contacts took time, as did organizing the data into usable categories.**

**For the later task, the Commission used four standard university divisions: institutional operations, academic affairs, community formation, and civic engagement. Several subcategories within each division further specify the environment-related data. The following are the categories and subcategories.**

The AJCU can utilize the ESER to gain a comprehensive understanding of the environmental**

This information offers institutions growth points in response to Pope Francis' request that we in the United States significantly increase our capacity to "hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor." At the same time, the AJCU can use this information to devise further support for Jesuit colleges and universities in this effort.**

## Appendix 2

### 7 LSGs Alignment with STARS

Below is an example of how colleges and universities might align their STARS reports to the 7 Laudato Sí Goals. Every college and university is unique, so institutions may list items a bit differently or find a some variations on the

example given. The point of the alignment is to assist institutions in finding a 'base line' of their eco-social activities relative to the 7 LSGs: seeing where the current institutional response to a given LSG is already strong and where the response is less so.
