- Use the letters we have sent home and ask your child to make 3 letter CVC words. CVC words have a consonant/vowel/consonant in them. These are also great to play a match game with. Ask your child to say the letter and sound as they turn over the letters.
- Use the orange Handwriting Without Tears book we sent home to practice printing. Ask your child to find a page they have not completed and use a pencil to practice proper letter formation.
- Ask your child to read one of the CVC decodable passages each school that we sent home and see if they can answer the questions that follow the passage. These are great to work on sounding out words and comprehension. Also ask your child to tell you the rhyming words in each passage.

## Language Arts:

- Use a piece of string, yarn or shoelace about the length of your child's arm and get them to measure objects around them to see if they are longer or shorter than the piece of string.
- Use coloured paper to cut stripes (one long and one short in each colour) then ask your child to sort them into the 2 categories of shorter or longer. We have provided the baggie of stripes for you to use and the paper to glue them onto.

We have learned and covered the following letters so far:

s, a, t, i, p, n, c, k, e, h, r

We will continue our letters when students return in January. Ask your child to practice writing these letters using a pencil, crayon or marker.

**\*\*Remember to use a pencil on practice sheets we send home.\*\***

We have been putting these letters together to read and write simple words: cat, sat, pat, hat, rat, pin, tin, rip, pen, ten, hen, tap, cap, can, car, tan, pan

\*sprinkle flour or sugar on a cookie sheet and practice drawing shapes, or writing numbers and letters with your finger

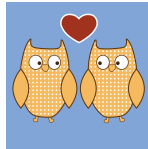
\*paint shapes, numbers, or letters
