# **College Planning Checklist for Parents**

9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Grades

### **FALL**

- o Use Naviance as a resource to help your student plan for high school, college, and career.
  - o If you have never logged in to Naviance, contact Ms. Snape for help.
  - o Discuss postsecondary options for careers of interest.
- o Learn about resources available to parents.
  - o Attend class meetings and other events of interest at the school.
- o Check in regularly about school.
  - o Help your student transition to high school by checking in about assignments and extracurricular activities.
  - o Encourage your student to meet with a counselor to determine which classes to take to prepare for college.

### WINTER

o Check in regarding your student's schedule for next year.

Students should take challenging classes in high school to prepare for college.

- o Start thinking about financial aid and paying for college.
  - o Have a discussion with your student about what you can afford.
  - o Start saving for college. Even if you can only save a few dollars each month, every little bit helps.

## **SPRING**

- o Help your student plan summer activities.
  - o Consider part-time jobs, summer enrichment programs, or volunteer opportunities in your community.
- o **Encourage your 10<sup>th</sup> grade student to take a practice PSAT.** While sophomore scores aren't used for college scholarship awards, taking the test early can help students be better prepared for the PSAT junior year and the SAT.

#### **SUMMER**

o **Visit colleges.** If possible tour a local school. If planning a family vacation, try to stop by a campus near your destination or on the way.

- $\circ$  Encourage your student to complete SSL requirements.
- o If your 10<sup>th</sup> grade student is interested in attending a United States military service academy, encourage your student to request a pre-candidate questionnaire.
