## "New Paths"

Merz Trio presents a program of 19th and early 20th-century masterworks, all quintessentially Viennese in style and all teeming with boundary-breaking energy. Beethoven's middle period masterwork, Op. 70 No. 2, is paired here with four later Viennese songs that draw attention to both its lyrical and virtuosic elements, while Brahms' glorious C Major Trio is paired with Merz Trio's virtuosic new arrangement of Ravel's La Valse, heard here as a full-fledged response to the dancelike, Viennese elements suggested throughout the Brahms.
