Waynesville Primary School hosts several events each year where the community businesses and civic organizations participate to provide fun, educational experiences for our students. These events are Open House, Curriculum Fair, Halloween Bash, BINGO nights, Thanksgiving Luncheons, PBIS Celebrations, and Book Fair. They are open to parents/guardians who are encouraged to attend and participate.

We involve a variety of team members in our wrap-around services including school nutrition, Birth to 5/Pre-K programs including Brantley Co. Schools Pre-K and Bright from the Start/Head Start, and whole-child/transition collaboratives including DFACS, Family Connections, local law enforcement/SROs, counselors, social workers, student success coach, teachers/admin, college/career/military representatives, and local community organizations.

# **BUILDING CAPACITY OF PARENTS/GUARDIANS**
