The play your student will see is called The Bubbylonian Encounter and is written by Gene Mackey updated by RESPECT. In this program about child sexual abuse prevention, actors interact with the students throughout the play to teach them how to identify safe versus unsafe touching. Children learn that they can say “no” to unsafe touching. They learn that private body parts are those covered by their bathing suits. They learn who they can ask or go to for help if they need it. They learn that it is OK to talk about “secrets” that make them feel uncomfortable.

The Bubbylonian Encounter has been produced in Omaha area schools for over 20 years and in hundreds of schools. The script is available in the school office for your viewing.

We invite you to join us in the audience for this important topic. Please talk with your student’s teacher for specific arrangements.

While the issues in the play may or may not be a specific issue at our school or for specific students, it is important to be pro-active in providing all students with the skills and information to be empowered as bystanders and to be able to help others as well as themselves have safe, happy and healthy relationships with others.
