Points to Remember

- The religious observances below are grouped by month by which the holiday occurs. This religious observance calendar charts holidays and observances from many cultures/ belief groups. Some holidays do not follow the Gregorian calendar and may occur in different dates, and even months from year to year. This occurrence can be referred to as 'Moving Holidays.' In such cases, the holidays will be grouped with the month in which they occur most frequently over the next three years. For example:
 - o The holiday, The Birth of Bahá'u'lláh is a celebration important to those of the Bahá'i faith. Their holiday's date occurs on the first and second day following the eighth new moon after Naw-Rúz, another holiday important to Bahá'is. The Birth of Bahá'u'lláh occurs on November 3rd in 2024, October 23rd in 2025, and November 11th in 2026. As such the holiday will appear in the November section as for the next three years it will occur a majority of the time in November, but this will be updated year by year.
- "Kosher restrictions apply" refers to the dietary guidelines of Jewish law which apply daily throughout the year. Restrictions include pork, shellfish (fish is allowed) and mixing meat with dairy.
- "Halal dietary restrictions apply" refers to the foods prohibited according to Islamic dietary law throughout the year. Restrictions include alcohol and pork.
