



# **Substitute Teaching Permit**

It is strongly recommended that all UCI student teachers apply for an Emergency 30-Day Substitute Teaching Permit. The UCI policy is that you may only substitute teach for your mentor teacher.

The easiest and fastest way to do this is to make an appointment with the Orange County Department of Education\*. Call to make an appointment and find out what documents you need to bring with you.

- What to Bring
  - o Official Transcripts Showing Your Bachelor's Degree
  - Basic Skills Requirement (The BSR is satisfied by your Bachelor's (or higher) degree beginning 6/29/2024.)
  - Fingerprinting
  - \$63.00 cash or check (no credit cards) for fingerprinting (amount may vary)

    - There is a \$100 processing fee for the CTC.

When you have been given your placement information, your next step is to apply for a substitute teacher position through the district. One nice benefit is you have the potential to make up the \$163 by subbing one day, and then make a little extra money after that.

Once you have this substitute teaching permit and know your school placement, you need to apply for a substitute position through your district. Student teachers are eligible to substitute only for their mentor teacher.

\*You do not need to go through the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) to obtain this substitute teaching permit. Contact your county office of education or you may apply directly through the CTC using the link above.

# **Student Representatives**

The student reps represent six content areas for each cohort. The goal is for Cohort A and Cohort B to have at least one representative from each content area - Math, Science, Art, English, World Language, and Science. The total number of reps ranges from 8-10 candidates. Due to the smaller sizes of art and world language, we typically have one art rep and one world language rep.

Student reps are committed to taking care of the academic, social, and emotional needs of the class by way of a spirit of unity, inclusion, support, and respect for everyone. They meet monthly throughout the school year and spend additional hours (within reason) planning activities/events/study groups and maintaining communications. In addition to building community, student reps are the VOICE for the class. Student reps play an important role in communicating cohort needs to the program coordinator. Student reps must be able to maintain good academic standing throughout the program.

Student reps are chosen by the Coordinator and two other MAT faculty members. If you feel that your leadership skills and content knowledge qualify you to be a highly effective student representative, please complete <u>this form</u>. The student rep role is completely voluntary - the reward is service and support of your peers and the MAT program.

# Anaheim Union High School District (AUHSD) Residency Program

The AUHSD STEM Residency Program is funded by a California Commission on Teacher Credentialing grant. AUHSD and the UC Irvine MAT and CalTeach programs collaborated to design a residency program that would increase the support provided to both mentor teachers and student teachers. This residency program provides a potential pathway to employment within AUHSD. It will increase the number of culturally and linguistically diverse teachers in STEM classrooms.

## Duration, location(s) and time commitment:

Residents are expected to serve the full length of the school year per the AUHSD district calendar beginning on the first contracted day to the last contracted day for teachers. Residents are expected to engage in a minimum of 700 hours of field-based activities during the school year, with a minimum of 200 in the fall quarter and 500 during the winter and spring quarters. Residents will be placed in Cypress, Katella, Kennedy, and Magnolia High Schools, or other AUHSD schools.

## District expectations for residents:

- Residents are expected to obtain <u>California Substitute Teaching Permits</u> so that they may be hired by the district and receive their payments.
- Commit to teaching a full academic year (First day of school to the last day). Commit to co-teaching 15-20 hours per week in the fall semester (part of summer session and all of fall quarter at UCI). For spring semester (winter and spring quarter at UCI), residents will teach or co-teach 5 days per week at 35 hours per week. This is necessary to meet the expectation that residents participate in all of the duties of a regular teacher for 50% of the school year.
- Residents are required to attend district professional learning that takes place during work hours and are highly encouraged to attend other professional learning opportunities that support their instructional practice.

## Resident obligation to the District and California Commission on Teacher Credentialing:

- All residents agree in writing to serve in a school within the jurisdiction of the grant recipient that sponsored the candidate for a period of at least four school years beginning with the school year that begins after the candidate successfully completes the initial year of preparation and obtains a preliminary teaching credential
- AUHSD staff will work with residents on identifying potential teaching positions if and as employment opportunities arise in the district.

### **Employment opportunities within AUHSD:**

- Residents will be onboarded as district employees by AUHSD human resources personnel prior to the start of the school year.
- AUHSD may provide opportunities for residents to work as substitute teachers for their mentor teachers during the academic year.
- AUHSD will notify residents of employment opportunities as soon as they are available and provide residents with early opportunities to interview, prior to posting positions publicly. AUHSD will also support the funding of the induction process for newly hired residents.

### Residency stipend:

Residents will receive a stipend for their work from AUHSD twice during the school year at the end of each semester. The total stipend amount for the school year will be \$12,000. Residents will receive two stipend checks of \$6,000 each. The compensation will reflect residents' completion of fieldwork hours and program good standing. Good standing is reflected by continued enrollment in the UC Irvine MAT or CalTeach programs and meeting the district expectations (as described above). Residents are not required to provide evidence of preparation program costs. The stipend paid to residents is subject to taxation, so residents should plan accordingly.

## Parking

- The closest parking structure to the Education Building is the Social Science Parking Structure (SSPS) in Zone 5 off Campus Drive. You can purchase parking permits through UCI Transportation and Distribution Services: https://parking.uci.edu/permits/
- Please note that you may not be able to purchase your parking pass until a few days prior to the orientation. At this point, all of your names and UCI netIDs are not registered in the system.

#### Commuters

- If you plan on arriving to OC/UCI early in the morning:
  - <u>UCI</u>: The <u>Student Center</u> is open starting at 7am. There are <u>study spaces</u> you can work in that are comfortable and cozy. There is also a <u>commuter lounge</u> that opens at 8am. The Starbucks at Student Center opens at 7:30am and the Starbucks down the street (by Albertsons) opens at 4:30am if you want to stop by there first. Peet's Coffee across the street opens at 6am daily.
  - School of Education: We have a study lounge (on the 2nd floor) that has a microwave for you to use.
  - <u>Placement</u>: Talk to your mentor teacher to find out when the school is open and explain your situation. A
    lot of the time, custodians are on campus pretty early and perhaps you can ask if you can come on
    campus early. If you can't come on campus early, find a Starbucks or other coffee shop that's open early
    on your way to school.
- If you need to wait out traffic in the afternoon:
  - <u>UCI/School of Education</u>: You can continue working from the Student Lounge in the Education building,
     UCI student center, or UCI library.
  - Placement: Check with your mentor teacher how late you can stay at your school site.
  - Public Libraries: Locating a public library near UCI or your placement is another great place to work from.
