# **Events**

**On March 13**, as part of our "Meetings with history" series, the lecture by prof. Marcin Kruszyński - "About the fathers of independence from the shadow of great politics and the life and activity of General Gustaw Orlicz-Dreszer" took place. Prof. M. Kruszyński is a lecturer at the Military Aviation Academy in Dęblin, as well as an employee of the Historical Research Office of the Institute of National Remembrance. During the meeting, prof. Kruszyński introduced the figure of General Gustaw Orlicz-Dreszer (1889-1936), one of the most important people in the group of collaborators of Marshal Józef Piłsudski.

**On March 21**, a meeting was held via communicator Zoom organized by the Polish Historical Club Austin Polish Society and was chaired by Joanna Sokołowska-Gwizdka, vice-president of Austin Polish Society and editor-in-chief of Culture Avenue magazine. The guests were Dr. Iwona Korga and Mr. Tomasz Jędrzejewicz, and son of the founder of the Institute, prof. Wacław Jędrzejewicz. The topics concerned the history and activities of the Institute as well as the father-son relationship.

**On March 24**, Dr. Iwona Korga met with sixth grade students from the MS 577 public school in Brooklyn. The meeting, initiated by the teacher of the same school, Katarzyna Wojtowicz, was held via the communicator Zoom and gathered almost one hundred students who listened with interest to the lecture on the history and collections of the Piłsudski Institute.

**On March 30**, we published a video about spring customs and Easter traditions. This presentation is our proposition for younger viewers who, due to the pandemic, we were unable to invite to the traditional pre-Christmas workshop at the Institute. #### In Memoriam

**On March 7, 2021**, Dr. Tomasz Księżyk died suddenly in Gdańsk at the age of 70. For a long time he was associated with the Piłsudski Institute in America, where he was a member of the Board of Directors in 1986-1989. The matters of Poland and Poles were always important to him.

He grew up in Częstochowa. He went to study in Dresden, and then lived in Warsaw. He came to New York in 1981 hoping for more opportunities for research in the newly emerging field of artificial intelligence. In 1988 he defended his PhD in computer science from New York University. Shortly thereafter, he moved to Austin, Texas, where his wife and daughters could finally join him. Dr. Tomasz Księżyk lived in Austin until 2016, after which he returned to Poland to spend his retirement. He was a collector of books, especially those about history and art. He appreciated the possibility of interweaving intense work on technical problems with deepening his humanistic interests.

On April 1, 2021, Antoni Chrościelewski, the commander of the 2nd District of the Polish Army Veterans Association in America, died at the age of 97. He was a long-time member of the Piłsudski Institute. In April 1940, together with his mother and sisters, he was transported from his native home Augustów to Siberia, then to northern Kazakhstan, where he spent 2 years. Upon hearing that General Anders was forming the Polish Armed Forces in the USSR, he joined the Polish. He went through the entire training and combat route of the 2nd Polish Corps, including one of the greatest battles of the Second World War - the Battle of Monte Cassino. He spent several years in London working in the factory of the French company Renault. In the 1950s, after arriving in New York, he worked in an American company gaining knowledge and experience, which allowed him to open his own business. Thanks to his success in the United States, he was able to devote himself tirelessly over the past several decades to be active in Polonia. In 1980 he became the President of the Polish National House in Greenpoint, he was also associated with the Polish Army Veterans Association in America. For his military merits, Mr. A. Chrościelwski received many orders and decorations including the Commander's Cross with the Star of the Order of Polonia Restituta, which was presented to him on September 30, 2020 by Consul General of RP in NY -Adrian Kubicki.

We express our sincere condolences to our family and friends.

On March 17, 1921, the Legislative Sejm of Poland passed the March Constitution. It was the first modern Polish constitution which, although formally in force as early as June 1, 1921, entered into full force only after the parliamentary elections and the subsequent presidential elections in 1922.
