Doucette: examples- with 4 classes, extra help, test bank, is now resource center b/c it was valuable, would be beneficial for students to speak at hearing on how they would benefit Alessandro: with less classes, class sizes up?

David: more teachers

Blumberg: where would extra salaries come from?

David: that's what they're discussing, there is some money now, another question is phasinghow would they change it

Doucette: in contract- when money is available, will try to get it back, apparently money is now available

Blumberg: how is the SC leaning?

David: seem that 2, maybe 3 are in favor, strong sense that this should be done, whether or not it can be done

Tomic: it seems that Senate should be in favor, sometimes forget faculty issues, think we should write a letter

David: Sen Haviland and Sen FM were at the meeting, can give insight, wondering what you think was the SC's impression

Christi Lee: should be in favor of this, will help students if teachers are less stressed

FM: on Saturday, went pretty well, Sen. Haviland and I planning on going on Tuesday, Dr. Ash didn't seem for it, 2 SC members in favor, felt good to be heard, a letter from the Senate would be very helpful and powerful, I talked about the effects on my personal life, said that I am constantly looking for schools with only 4 classes, on the state, admin level, loads getting worse, having a hard time hiring/keeping teacher, extra help with me is crazy this year

David: tried to be objective, would like a letter, but don't want to put pressure, or to be seen as "manipulating" students

Fitzgerald: not sure if students can speak to this, don't know the issue

Tomic: we might not be directly affected, but we have a large stake, impacts everyone, we can talk about how it would impact students, think we can and should do something, are there any concerns besides budget?

Ryan Lee: Student- Faculty Senate, should be written by both, don't know of any negative reason, don't think Mr. David has "manipulated" me

FM: students can't speak to teacher perspective, can talk about what students would gain, Ms. Floerke said that students apologize to her for asking for extra, whether its students or the Student-Faculty Senate, you do have a stake

Blumberg: from the faculty, what would be the improvements

Wambe: is there a committee that would write?

Blumberg: we'll talk about it

Doucette: can talk about teacher's availability to meet with students, after-school extra help times is a zoo, going back to iPad discussion, that money could be better spent, can talk about

how this would improve education, could present letter in person at the next meeting

Xu: without understanding cause, can see effects, reducing teacher stress would help us

Zedros: feeling the effects of X Block, could look at FlexBlock as reducing stress

Alessandro: are teachers fired from 4 to 5 classes

David: what would arguments be against? Dr. Ash had a list of improvements- we said causation vs. correlation, achievement gap dropped, better scores for students of color, rebuttal- we had interventions put in place

Park: do most teachers teach 5 classes?

Pfrommer: my mom is "part time" but teaches 4 classes, get personal attention from English teachers, it's not just papers but it's 25 more teachers to know

Haviland: Sen. David talked a bit about other arguments against, Dr. Ash didn't bring up stats during SC, I have 4 preps, it's better for students, some students who could take honors who choose to take level I, need time to have creative lesson plans, esp. with technology, for me it takes years

Tomic: when is the next major meeting? when would we present the letter

Tomic: won't have another Senate meeting before sent, can't vote before it's been written, might be complicated, can figure out how to get "seal of approval", we can figure it out

SB: everyone needs to sign up for something – other stuff that could happen includes makeup tests, labs, etc.

Christi Lee: if students are good at what they do and a teacher could recommend them, maybe they could be peer mentors / TA's

Wong: can study halls count toward 990?

SB: no but "guided studies" do so...

Doucette: most teachers are by themselves in a homeroom – we'd need to have a lot of people covering homerooms if there will also be stuff like Senate

Suraj: the next easiest thing after homeroom is signing up for a teacher – ex. my English class – some classes are in really high demand

Wambe: students-as-teachers is a good idea – could make it an official LHS position probably; would people be able to come to the library if there's overcrowding? Blumberg: we'll ask Ms. Lasa

Zedros: the library will definitely be popular – also students-as-teachers is nice, maybe it should have some sort of community service incentive

Tomic: our different ideas are not incompatible – we could have options like extra help / peer mentoring / sit in the library / optional additional classes (like Extended Physics works right now or AP test prep) – Senate would fall under this umbrella

Kaufman: X block can be like IE block in the middle schools – people can make up stuff but the default should be a choice between mini-classes that are still educational (intro to physics, et cetera)

Delity: it's not flexible enough – if people feel they need help in a certain area, they should be able to excuse themselves from their default activity

Quan: it's unfair to rule out all clubs – many could be more productive than sitting in a study hall – let's have a certification process for academic clubs

Wang: can we allow choice by week?

SB: in terms of attendance, we can't really do that reasonably

Fitzgerald: if we had actual gym classes to get credit for, perhaps this time could make up stuff – people would skip an open gym class

Pfrommer: we're very dedicated students here but those who aren't might try to cut corners a lot – we need to assure better accountability

Clive Chan: if Aspen can handle it, we could have a general check-in in which you could be marked present by anyone

Leung: if anyone could go to the library, it'd become overcrowded – not a feasible default SB: pass

Tomic: Senate meetings are meant to be open to all students and previous rules dictate that no other activity can occur simultaneously

Cherenson: people will be essentially teaching another block - responsibilities problems

Lasa: we've tried that, police can't commit to someone there, unless cigarette in students hand, I can't do anything, same issue with freshmen and sophomores leaving campus

Cherenson: in my experience, I walk there, I haven't had any issues, is there really a solution? Lasa: not really, students tend to go to familiar places, looking at a very small percentage of the population

Pfrommer: part of the problem is the rest of the school body doesn't treat those students well, we haven't talked to any of them

Tomic: bench idea is worth trying, different from older ideas, approaching from trying to benefit everyone, have students approach them, main question is how, is the issue funds? Senators would be willing to spend some time organizing this

Lasa: funds aren't an issue, think benches in general is a good idea, in a couple of places, could help E-Board figure out how to ask them to move-- delicate situation

Josh Kim: could admin have a consequence to make people fear smoking there?
