Managing Downloads Folder


Chromebooks come with a locally-stored downloads folder likewise of a Windows or MacOS machine. Many are unaware of this feature and often allow the folder to become heavily stored in. As a result, this may slow down the device. The steps below outline how to identify and clean out a downloads folder.

How to Access the Downloads Folder

01. Open the finder from the bottom-left of the taskbar.



02. If present, select the "**Files**" application. If not, click the menu extender to view more applications.



03. In the extended menu (if open), select the "**Files**" application.



Navigating "Files"

01. On the left sidebar, you will see it broken down into three different categories. Each is identified and described below.




- Quick Access: These break down local files into their respective categories.
- Local: These files are stored <u>locally</u> (NOT backed up/in Google Drive).
- Google Drive: This gives access to your Google Drive (including folders).
- 02. To view your downloads folder, click "**My Files**" then "**Downloads**" (if collapsed).



You will see all of your downloads here.

03. To delete a file, click on the desired file, then the trash can icon.



04. To move a file to Google Drive, click and drag the file to the "Google Drive" section.
