Business Meeting

- **4.1.** Faculty Senate President's Report (Steve Scheck)
- 1. Senate Seat Assignments
 - The executive committee used HR data to determine faculty FTE (Full-Time Equivalent) and make senate seat assignments.
 - Two methods of FTE calculation were used (annual average and term-by-term analysis), yielding the same results.
 - Some divisions gained seats due to a change in how faculty are counted -now including all faculty equally, regardless of tenure-track status.
 - This shift stems from a prior Senate decision to move away from unequal counting of faculty types.





- Behavioral Sciences and Business/Economics divisions each gained a seat.
- Senate encouraged divisions to select senators based on the new seat allocations in upcoming division meetings.

2. Bylaw Suspension and Elections

- A motion was passed (by ²/₃+ majority) to suspend Senate bylaws to expedite elections for certain positions.
- Mike Baltzley was confirmed as Faculty Senate President for 2025–2026.
- Tim Cowart was confirmed as Secretary.
- Vice President and at-large executive committee positions have multiple candidates and will be decided by secret ballot in two weeks:
 - o Vice President candidates: Patricia Giménez-Eguíbar and Camila Gabaldón
 - o At-large candidates: Melissa Cannon, Xiaopeng Gong, and Michael Freeman

4.2. University President's Report (Jesse Peters)

Lobby Day & Legislative Advocacy

- WOU Lobby Day is scheduled for Thursday.
- President Peters and others have been engaging legislators to advocate for regional universities.
- Emphasis on: Who attends regional universities / The economic realities of regional vs. larger institutions/ Preserving higher education funding in the face of federal/economic uncertainty

Achievements and Institutional Events

- WOU achieved Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI) designation, publicly announced at the HSI Summit.
- Cesar Chavez Leadership Conference brought over 1,000 high school students to campus.
- Student Success Center Grand Opening held, with strong community support.
- Upcoming key events: Employee Celebration, June 6, Academic Excellence Showcase, Athletic Auction, Board of Trustees Meeting week before graduation

4.3. University Provost's Report (José Coll)

- Academic Excellence Day is on May 29; faculty presence encouraged.
- Plans to expand faculty/staff recognition beyond the Pestega Awards at the college level.
- Dean Search for College of Education has concluded; announcement pending.
- Melanie Landon-Hays is the new Director of General Education.





- Jensen Lecture Series scheduled for May 22; future speaker recommendations to be solicited.
- **4.4**. ASWOU/Student Senate Report (Student Senator Anfisa Boianoff reported for Student Senate)
 - Hosted mental health awareness event and tabling for resources.
 - Started a student newsletter to improve communication and transparency.
 - Participated in state and regional lobby days (May 7 and May 15).

 - Ongoing student elections and a turf referendum proposing a \$10 fee increase per student.
 - Passed resolutions clarifying advisor roles, office requirements, and public meeting rules.

7.1. Academic Sustainability Committee update

Academic Sustainability Committee

- Meeting weekly; breaking work into weekly "bite-sized" deliverables.
- Current focus: assembling data sets for future program reviews (e.g., fill rates, credit hours, gen ed breakdowns).
- Committee is not evaluating departments, only defining the framework and metrics for future reviews.
- Updates to be a standing agenda item in future Senate meetings.

7.2. <u>Update</u> on admissions/retention (Paige Jackson, Assistant Provost, Enrollment Management & Student Success and Joy Brown, Director of Undergraduate Admissions)

Context & Challenges:

- Oregon high school graduate numbers are declining and projected to drop 19% by 2041
- Oregon exports many of its graduates to out-of-state schools.
- Highly competitive recruitment environment.

Strategic Changes & Progress:

- Common App implementation increased applications by 266%.
- Increased application completion, admissions offers, and confirmed enrollment.
- First OPU to send financial aid packages early (by March).
- New systems for advising handoffs, conditional admissions, and CRM optimization.
- Strong collaboration with marketing, financial aid, advising, and retention teams.

Early Results:

- 90% of first-year enrollment goal reached by May 1.
- First-year confirmations up; transfer applications up 15%.





 Early advising appointments and registrations have already exceeded last year's benchmarks

Future Plans:

- More targeted recruitment, especially in Oregon and border states.
- New campus visit experience and tour revamp.
- Earlier application cycle launch (August 1) and increased outreach to juniors and sophomores.
- Ongoing need for faculty support in communication and participation.

7.3. Nomination committee <u>will launch</u> a general discussion about Faulty Senate governance structure: **Senate Structural Review and Reform**

- Nominating committee (led by Mary Pettinger) initiated discussion on improving Faculty Senate function and participation.
- Issues identified:
 - Difficulty finding willing senators
 - o Zoom/hybrid meetings reducing engagement
 - o Committee structures potentially outdated
- Plan to collect ideas now and hold a focused discussion at the May 27 meeting.
- Possibility of revisiting:
 - o In-person vs. hybrid format
 - o Monthly vs. biweekly meetings
 - o Committee numbers and structures
- Faculty encouraged to send input to Dr. Elisa Maroney, Chair of this committee. .
