[Gale eBooks](#) (no login required)

A collection of nonfiction eBooks for reference and research. Topics include medicine, literature, history, science & technology, the arts, and more.

[Gale In Context](#) (no login required; optional sign in with Google)

Academic articles, images, and more, from encyclopedias, magazines, newspapers, etc. This database has lots of accessibility tools and filtering options to support your learning whatever level you're at!

[Gale in Context: Global Issues](#) (no login required; optional sign in with Google)

Curated to focus on current issues from across the world. Categories include health and medicine, science and technology, government and law, environment and climate change, society and culture, business and economy, and conflict and diplomacy.

[Gale in Context: Opposing Viewpoints](#) (no login required; optional sign in with Google)

Organized by topic. Each topic includes a background of the issue, plus curated articles representing multiple different perspectives and opinions. This is a great tool for getting a broad overview of a problem or issue, and getting a well-rounded – but factual and well-researched – understanding of the different ideas surrounding it.
