 - Looking at how to collect resources to put together a coherent strategy across OpenSSF to engage with academia
 - Academic Accreditation is moving forward
 - We should think about folding other educational efforts together; look to group everything academic facing, everything LF-related, etc.
 - [DavidW] Probably need to identify the benefits to both sides. I think there's an opportunity, need to put some meat on the bones for specifics.
 - [Justin] Two basic approaches - every academic sees this as a shiny area and wants to participate; make a safe home that keeps industry strongly engaged so conference quality remains high
 - Can we accomplish both? Are there any other approaches that should be considered?
 - Maybe coordinate with an existing conference like ACSAC, maybe NDSS. Usenix has fallen on harder times.
 - Next Steps:
 - [Justin] Academics need to have a similar discussion and take some steps down the path - they they will be more ready to do the actual thing proposed in the issue

- [DavidW] Schedule a virtual meeting with a whiteboard prior to the holidays to figure some of this out, and incorporate them into the plan for 2026 - **@Justin** will put a group chat together to try and plan this
 - [David] - let's meet within ~3 weeks
- [David W] Courses have been added to the US Government's NICCS [catalog](#) (in addition to LFD121) as of Nov 19
 - Security for Software Development Managers (LFD125); Understanding the EU Cyber Resilience Act (CRA) (LFEL1001); Secure AI/ML-Driven Software Development (LFEL1012). LFD121 was already there.

- [DavidW] Note: Added LFEL1001 to "Tradewinds" list - provides US government a list of AI-related technologies.
 - More generally, please help us get the word out about our courses. We think they're good, but that only matters if people learn about them & take them.
- [DavidW] What courses do people really want to see in the future? We have limited resources, need to focus on a few. Ideas:
 - Anything AI related is likely to be of interest!
 - One possibility: How to integrate AI securely into delivered systems (we intentionally didn't cover that in LFEL1001). Problem: we don't know how to do that well, most techniques people advocate don't really work.
 - Security Architecture
 - Risk Assessment
 - Noted earlier
 - Security Risk Assessments. Build on CNCF, OpenSSF guides, OWASP guides, Cyber insurance companies, etc. Cyberrisk analysis currently often poor.
 - Of your own project / product / org, or of someone else's
 - Maybe OSS Newbie? <https://github.com/ossf/education/issues/72>
- [Justin] How do we deal with new / emerging topics wrt academic accreditation?
 - Should we be creating commonly used artifacts for things like Baseline? (the maintainers can create something to be used by others)
 - Maybe determine a list of topics each year and create common artifacts for them?
 - **@Justin** will bring this up in the next Academic Accreditation meeting
 - Let's create links from Education SIG GitHub page to some shared artifacts
