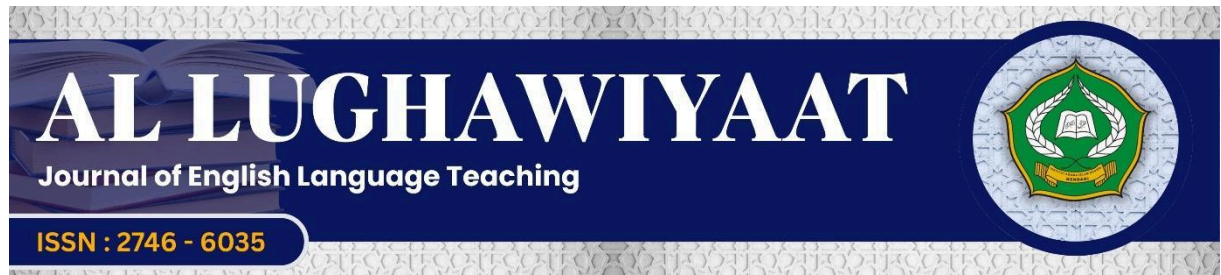

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### ABSTRACT

Abstract is written in English. The abstract should be 150 to 200 words in Cambria Math (Size 10). The abstract covers the research objectives and benefits, research method, research result and conclusion. The authors explain the research objectives and benefits why the research needed to be conducted and what makes it different from other previous researches. Besides, the authors also describe all the research instruments to collect the data, such as using pre-determined questions to do interview, or observation checklist during observation. Finally, the authors will describe the research result as well as the implications.

### 1. Introduction

The introduction contains the background of the research and the literature review used in the study. This section also explains previous studies related to the research to show the state of the art or the distinguishing aspect that becomes the novelty of this study compared to the previous ones.

All sections of the article must be typed in Cambria Math font (size 10) with 1.0 spacing. The introduction should be written in approximately one page at maximum. Overall, the article should be written in 8-15 pages.

### 2. Research Methods

In this section, the author may explain the research method used, including the procedures for data collection, analysis, and drawing conclusions from the collected data. This section should be written descriptively and limited to half a page.

### 3. Findings And Discussion

In this section, the author presents the research results. The author should clearly and concisely describe the scientific findings obtained from the conducted research. The presentation of research results must be supported by sufficient data. The scientific findings referred to in this section are the data obtained from the research.

#### Sub-heading of Discussion

Following the main title, subtitles must be provided in the manuscript during the preparation process. The separation between the main title, subtitles, and sub-subtitles should be numbered in the manuscript, as shown in the example.

This section presents the interpretation of the research results and findings, which should be able to answer the hypothesis stated in the introduction. In this part, the author must also explain the novelty of this research compared to previous studies.

The discussion should highlight the relationship between the findings and the opinions of experts. This section does not only present the interpretation of the results but also explains why such results were obtained, supported by relevant expert opinions that need to be considered.

#### Sub-heading of Discussion

Supporting data such as tables, charts, images, or maps should be placed within the text group, following the point where the data is referenced. Each supporting data item must have a title placed below it, numbered sequentially, followed by the title. For tables, an open table format should be used.

Images must be ensured to be clearly printable (font size, resolution, and line thickness must be suitable for clear printing). The text inside the tables should be written in 10 pt font size with 1.0 spacing.
