- COVID-19 Relief for Undocumented Immigrants in CA
 - *Please note: Beginning Monday May 18, the State of California is providing one-time state-funded relief to undocumented immigrant workers who are ineligible for federal aid via the CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security) because of their immigration status. Individuals interested in applying for relief should contact the nonprofit organization in their county/region (see directory here). Those who qualify can receive \$500 in direct assistance, with a maximum of \$1000 in assistance per household.

Resources for University of California (UC) Students

- The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act signed into law March 28, 2020, provided funding directly to higher education institutions to support the costs of shifting classes online, and for emergency relief to federally eligible students for basic needs, technology, and other purposes.
