Google Maps is an online mapping software. It uses geolocation technology. It allows you to take a virtual tour of the planet.

Use <u>Google Maps</u> software to explore the territory, identify its various features and understand land-use planning. The Google Maps satellite images make it easy to see the main geographical features (population concentration, roads, means of transport, etc.) and the organization of a given territory.





The Pegman Tool

You can use the Pegman tool to get more clues about a location on Google Maps. Drag the Pegman character onto the map. This will give you a street view of the location.

1- Go to Google Maps.



2- Grab the Pegman character (the yellow icon in the bottom right-hand corner of the screen) and drop it on the desired spot on the map. Note: the spot must be blue.

3- Take a stroll around the area and look for clues. Sometimes, you can even go inside buildings.



4. Return to the aerial map by clicking on the arrow on the left of the screen. An aerial map gives you a view of the territory from above, like the view you would have in an airplane.
