The assembly stands. All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the leader begins.

our light and our salvation. Amen.

GATHERING SONG


The time of gathering song may be brief or extended, and may include one or more of the following: hymns, psalms; a Kyrie; a canticle of praise.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **And also with you.**




SECOND READING: Romans 3:19-28
