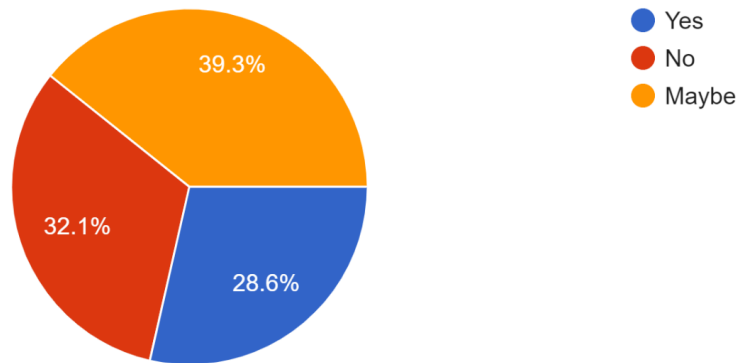


Lions Pride PTO Secondary Parent Survey

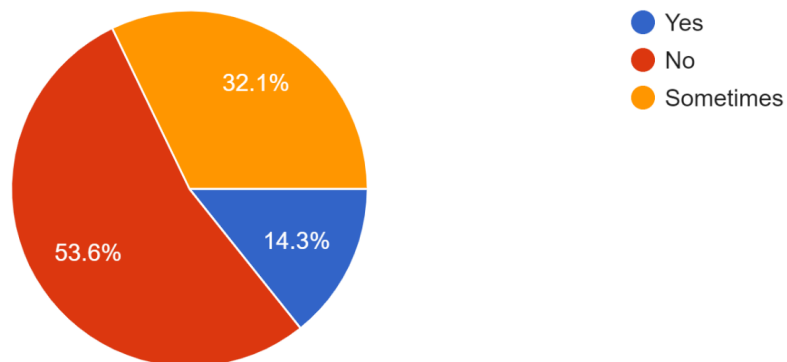
Will you be attending the meeting on March 20, 2023, 5PM-6PM?

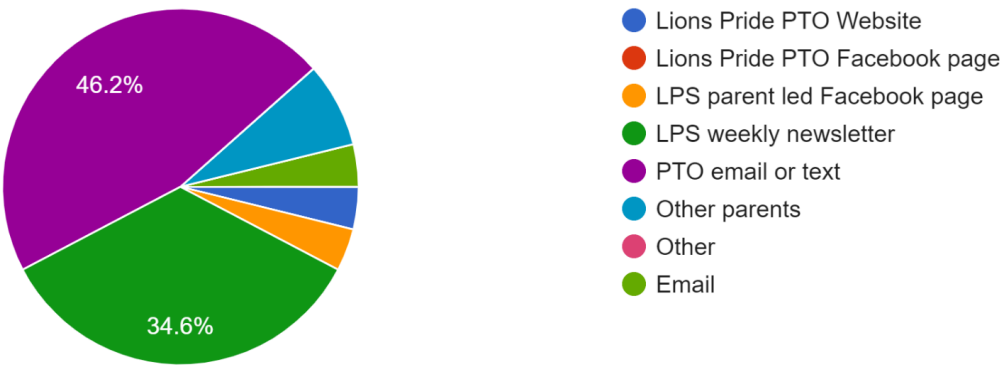
Have you found it difficult or easy to find volunteer opportunities at LPS? 21 responses

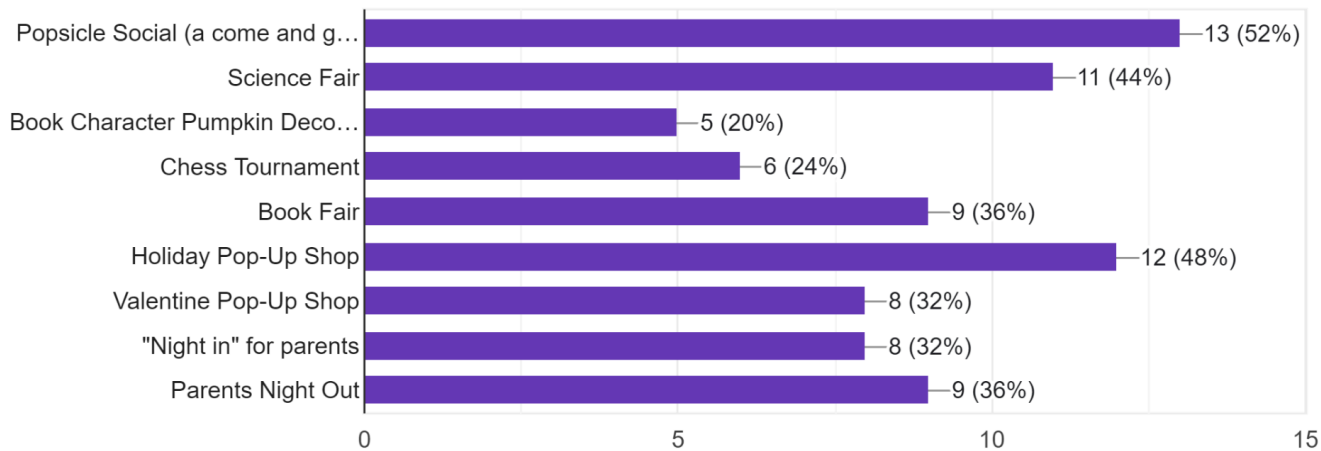

There used to be a punch card system related to servant leadership with parents that was great; it wasn't the reason to do the service, but was an added smart perk that was sort of a tangible way to work towards something (like a reward for your student) while also "doing good"...it was like good on top of good, if that makes sense.

Parent Response: Phone texting would be helpful form of communicating events and servant opportunities

PTO Response: We will work on sending more communication via Blackboard text to cellular phones along with emails. Please make sure your phone number and current email address are signed up to receive these messages.

Parent Response: Something that would help with security around campus. Maybe like a neighborhood watch but just parents volunteering walking around the outside of the campus. We have issues with affording it so helping out someway as parents would help all of us feel better that our students and staff are a little more protected.

PTO Response: We do recall this taking place a few years back and are not sure why it was not continued but we will be brainstorming to implement something similar for the upcoming school year.

Parent Response: Understanding how much us raised and where funds are allocated.

PTO Response: We will be discussing PTO's financial budget at the meeting and plan to share this information on the PTO website moving forward.

Parent Response: Would love to know what the volunteer response of high school parents is on campus. I feel like that could be an area of growth. Thank you for all you do!

PTO Response: We currently do not have a high volunteer response from high school parents and it's usually the same parents volunteering over and over. PTO plans to improve and explore different avenues of communication with all secondary parents to increase parent response in the near future.

Parent Response: Direct interaction platform such as discord where parents can communicate and a history of questions is available so that what can be seen as a simple question to some is answered quickly in some cases without even having to ask.

PTO Response: I believe LPS as a whole is trying to limit the amount of communication platforms so that it is not overwhelming for parents when receiving and seeking information. However, there are some Facebook Parent pages along with our official school page that have been good platforms for questions and are usually quickly answered.
