Master of Nursing Program Requirements

Full-time students are expected to complete the program requirements in 5 terms. Full-time students must maintain continuous enrollment with 2 courses a semester. Part-time students are expected to complete the program requirements in 3 years (or 9 terms) and maintain continuous enrollment with at least 1 course a semester. Not all courses are available for enrollment in every semester. See program plans for more details.

Course Details

Core courses MN8901, MN8902, and MN8903 must be completed within the first 3 terms of registration for full-time students and within the first 4 terms for part-time students.

All classroom course hours are for 36 hours per semester except the Practicum in Professional Nursing Advancement. Course requirements, assignments and methods of evaluation vary by course and may include scholarly papers, seminar presentations, examinations or evaluations by self, peers or others. Students receive letter grades for all courses except the Practicum in Professional Nursing Advancement course where students receive a pass/fail mark. The minimum passing grade for graded courses is B-.

All Required Core and Field Core courses must be successfully completed before you can enroll in MN8904 Seminar in Professional Nursing Advancement and MN8905 Practicum in Professional Nursing Advancement. Please note that MN8905 Practicum in Professional Nursing Advancement is an intensive practice experience where the student is in a practice setting for 16 hours per week over the 12-week term (192 hours). This practicum course is taken concurrently with MN 8904 Seminar in Professional Nursing Advancement which requires class attendance for 3 hours per week over the same 12 weeks.

Course Pre-Registration

All new students must pre-register in courses for their upcoming Academic Year using the Master of Nursing Course Selection Request Form. All course selections and enrolments are finalized and approved by the Graduate Program Administrators.

Step One: Review this Welcome Package

Step Two: Submit your Course Selection Request Form

These forms will open on **Wednesday, June 17, 2026** and must be completed by **Wednesday, July 22, 2026**. Note that it is in your best interest to submit this form as soon as possible.

Step Three: Course Pre-Registration confirmation

Before **August 19th**, an email containing a personalized Program Plan with your approved pre-registrations will be sent to you by a program administrator. If you have not submitted your Course Selection Request Form by the August deadline, your first-year schedule will be assigned to you by the program. Be sure to bookmark or otherwise save your program plan for reference.

Note that although the program makes every effort to accommodate a “First” choice selection request, pre-registration is on a first-received basis. The program reserves the right to hold enrollment of each course at a maximum class size. If the program is unable to accommodate your “First” choice course selection request, indicated subsequent choices are applied. If no subsequent choices are specified, courses will be chosen for you that fit your schedule and program requirements.

Step Four: Course Enrollment

After August 19, 2026, administrators will use new students' approved Program Plan to enroll them for the Fall 2026 term. This will include the administrative placeholder course *GD1001 Continuing Graduate Studies (Research)* which is used for counting active students. It is not graded and there is no fee attached.

Should you find an anomaly in your course registration in MyServiceHub, please inform the Program Administrator as soon as possible by phone or by email.

Step Five: Complete your Program Plan

In mid-October 2026, new students will be given access to edit their digital Program Plan form and notified by email. By making course selections on this form, students complete the pre-registration process for the rest of their degree progression. From the Winter 2027 term onwards administrators will use this approved digital Program Plan to complete the enrollment process. Be sure to bookmark your program plan for reference.

Students are not permitted to drop courses but may submit a course change request via email to the Graduate Program Assistant. Any course change requests must be sent on or before the term's last date to add or drop a course. Fees

Pay your Deposit

To confirm your acceptance to Toronto Metropolitan University, you must pay your non-refundable tuition deposit between **June 1 and June 14, 2026**, or by the confirmation date outlined in your offer letter. Please see instructions on how to pay your deposit at the following link:

*Note that many banks still list Ryerson and not Toronto Metropolitan University as a payee. If this is the case, please use Ryerson to pay your fee.

Tuition

For the Master of Nursing program your tuition is a term charge, which is based on the number of enrolled courses (units) in a given term throughout the three terms in the graduate calendar. The basis of your program status (part- or full-time) is NOT a factor when calculating your tuition fees.

For example, if you are enrolled in the full-time course load of two courses for the fall term, you would be charged the equivalent of two units of tuition plus the appropriate ancillary fees. If you are a part-time student enrolled in one course for the fall term, then you would be charged the equivalent of one unit of tuition plus the appropriate ancillary fees.

The approximate total domestic tuition cost for the MN Program is \$12,500 plus ancillary fees. In considering the overall tuition cost of your program, you need to multiply the number of required degree or certificate courses by the posted tuition amount found on the relevant Fees Information page:

Master of Nursing (MN)
