Quick Tip #17 - Behavior Sheet

Sometimes we need a behavior plan for those students that don't know what they're doing. I sat down and watched one time what my students <u>were</u> doing that was getting on my nerves and distracting the class, and I decided to separate them (behaviors) out in different boxes.

If they get three or more tallies for the day, then they send it home. I've only had to do it once. So it does work! But here's what does not work...

It doesn't work to recycle the papers and use them again. They get frustrated with it; they shove it out of their way. It's physically annoying for them to see that they've already got marks on it. So, it doesn't matter if you're trying to save paper. Do it. Because a clean slate is what every kid deserves. It seems to work much better for them this way anyway.

We give them a clean slate - It <u>looks</u> like a clean slate - they can <u>see</u> it. If you don't want to waste paper, find another way to do it.
