English (4 ½ Credits)

Grades 9 - 11: English or Honors English

Grade 12: Speech and English or College English 151 & College Lit 150

Social Studies (4 Credits)

Grades 9 & 10: World History I and II, American Government, Human Geography

Grades 11 & 12: U.S. History, Econ., and one other elective.

PE/Health Credits (1 ½ Credits)

Grades 9 & 10 Physical Education

Grade 10 Health

Math Credits (3 Credits)

Grades 9 & 10: One credit each year (Algebra I/Geometry)

Grades 11 or 12: One credit (Algebra II)

Science Credits (3 Credits)

Grade 9 & 10: Physical Science 9, Biology, and Chemistry or Physics

Art (1 Credit)

One credit in grades 9 - 12 of Music, Visual, Theatre, or other approved Art Credit

Quarterly Honor Rolls - Three honor rolls, "4.0", "A", and "B" are computed each quarter. The GPA for the quarter determines the honor rolls. 4.0 = 4.00; A = 3.50 - 3.99; B = 2.85 - 3.49.

Honor Graduate Requirements - Students will be eligible for graduating with honors based on their cumulative GPA at the end of the first semester. Students who meet the following criteria will determine those honors: Honors - 3.5; Special Honors - 3.7; Highest Honors - 3.9 *Grades and rank are unweighted.

College Now Program Information - Southwest Minnesota State University

College Now classes are open to eligible juniors and seniors. Application for the program happens in the spring of the previous year. Juniors who are eligible are in the top 1/3 of their class and have earned a 3.0 cumulative GPA. Seniors who are eligible are in the top ½ of their class and have earned a 3.0 cumulative GPA.
