Most of the courses will be run at Redeau Ball Diamonds on Redeau Lake Road

Entries Open	Entries open Sunday, May 26th at 7 pm PST Entries received before the opening date/time will NOT be accepted.
Entries Close	Pre-entries close June 9 2024 at 5:00 PM or when limit is reached Entry Limits: 7 hours of judging
Entry Fee	<i>\$18 per entry; \$12 per entry for puppy aptitude tests</i> Day of Show: \$25 per entry if the trial is not full. No refunds after the close date.

Entry Fees:

Before the closing date: \$18 per entry; \$12 per entry for puppy aptitude tests

Day of Show (if the trial is not full): \$25 per entry

No refunds after the close date.

All prices are in Canadian dollars.

Please note the prices but **do not pay yet!**

Once the trial secretary has received your entry, you will receive a confirmation email. You must send payment within 48 hours of that email, or your trial spot will be given to someone else if there is a waitlist.

A Final Confirmation of entries and a judging schedule will be e-mailed to all exhibitors around a week before the trial date.

Dog Eligibility:

Dogs of any breed or mixed breed, aged six months of age or old on the trial date, may compete in Level 1 and above. Dogs of any breed or mixed breed, older than 4 months of age but younger than nine months of age, may compete in the Puppy Aptitude Test.

Dogs may enter concurrently in multiple levels in which they are eligible to compete. Ex. A dog with their Level I title of any event may run Level I and Level II in the same trial for that event.

All dogs must be registered with NASDA to compete.

Deaf and/or blind dogs may compete in any event classes that are on leash.

Dogs with missing limbs or in wheelchairs are eligible to compete, provided they have a veterinary or physiotherapist letter and do not appear to be in pain.

The judge may accept veterinary or physiotherapist letters as proof of soundness, providing the dog does not appear to be visibly in pain.

Bitches in Season:

Bitches in season will be permitted to compete. Bitches in season must compete at the end of the class and wear pants. Please let the trial chair know a week before the trial if this occurs, if at all possible. Bitches in season will have a designated potty area.

Rules:

Freelife Canine reserves the right to remove any individual for any reason from the premises. Corrections, harsh training methods, abusive behaviours towards dogs or people, and corrective equipment will not be tolerated. No refunds will be issued.

Equipment:

If competing on lead, dogs must wear a flat buckle or snap collar. Harnesses that are fixed - for example, tracking or body harnesses are also permitted. Leashes should be long enough to provide adequate slack.

Martingale and slip collars may be used on the grounds but may not be utilized during an on-lead search. Head halters, prong collars, moving harnesses (such as "no-pull" harnesses) and any harnesses that are designed to be correctional are not allowed. Electronic collars which provide vibration, shock, sound, or spray/chemical corrections are not permitted on trial grounds, however, GPS and location collars are permitted on course. Judges may request proof or to examine the collar should questions arise.

Quarry:

Domestic rats will be used as a quarry as per NASDA rules. Care of the quarry is of the utmost importance to the judge, the host, and the organization. Please follow all rules and the judge's directions regarding the quarry. Refusing to do this may result in you removing from the trial with no refunds.

Freelife Canine reserves the right to not allow dogs to compete in quarry events without a muzzle if the team has been advised at a prior event that they must wear a muzzle due to how hard the dog hits/works the quarry box.

Awards:

There will be no official awards or ribbons at this trial as qualifying scores and titles will not be recorded as official until they have been received and reviewed by NASDA officials.

Non-official "Fun" prizes and raffles will be awarded for volunteers and categories such as "judges choice," "most entertaining run" etc.

Refunds:

No entries will be canceled or refunded without a veterinarian's certificate. No refunds will be made for cancellations after the closing date or entries that are absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the decision of the Trial Host or judge(s).

General Notice to Exhibitors:

Exhibitors must agree to being filmed and their videos shared with NASDA. All runs will be filmed and uploaded to a media sharing platform such as YouTube or Vimeo. Videos and their respective links will not be made public but may be used for future educational purposes through NASDA.

Refunds will be mailed seven days after the event.

No refunds will be made for dogs dismissed on the day of the trial for having sutures, open wounds, or are visibly lame. The judge's decision is final in these cases, even if a veterinary or physiotherapy note is presented.

No refunds will be made for cancellations after the closing date or entries that are absent, disqualified, excused or barred from competition by the decision of the Trial Host.

Exhibitors are responsible for complete, accurate, and legible information on their entry forms.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behaviour of their dogs, children and/or guests. Any exhibitor whose dogs, children and/or guests repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behaviour may be asked to leave the trial site at the discretion of the Trial Committee. In such a case, no refund on any entry will be made.

Exhibitors will be crating out of their vehicles. All dogs must be crated or on a leash when not competing. All dogs must be under control when they leave the course. Any dog engaging in aggressive or out of control behaviour when leaving the course will be disqualified and/or required to leave the trial site. **NO REFUND** of fees will be paid.

Exhibitors are responsible for being in the designated waiting area when it is their turn to run.

Freelife Canine reserves the right to refuse any entry without cause or explanation.

Please respect the venue and ensure you are cleaning up after your dog.
