Practicum Experience

Practicum Requirements:

- Final presentation of a completed teaching or training project

Doctoral Dissertation Requirements

The doctoral dissertation must demonstrate original research in biblical education, curriculum theory, or ministry training. Students may focus on pedagogical frameworks, scripture-centered curriculum models, or biblical literacy initiatives.
