How to find commonly used resources for DLeaFs

- <u>Digital Learning Scope & Sequence</u>: The DLSS articulates digital learning outcomes aligned to the ISTE Standards for Students (ISTE) and SFUSD's Core Curriculum. These learning outcomes help articulate digital skills that build towards the competencies articulated in SFUSD's Graduate Profile and prepare students for success in college, career, & life in the 21st century.
- <u>Time Log form</u>: Submit your hours throughout the year.
- <u>Dashboards</u>: Keep track of what you've submitted to the form & total hours

What is the "Digital Backpack"?

The SFUSD Digital Backpack is a collection of resources that:

- 1) Are safe and secure for students to use, and
- 2) Are easy to access through a Single Sign On (SSO) tool, like <u>Clever</u>

How do I know if something is in the Backpack?

Check out the SFUSD Digital Backpack website!

What if something isn't in the Backpack? Can I use it?

Tools that collect NO student Personally Identifiable Information are ok to use! Tools that collect ANY student Personally Identifiable Information, including email or first name, are not permitted for use. (Why? Unless vendors have signed a privacy agreement with SFUSD, they may illegally misuse student information.)

How do I get something approved so that it can go in the Digital Backpack? Per SFUSD District Announcement August 26, 2020:

At this time we must concentrate on supporting the apps that have already been approved and ensuring a successful start of school. The Departments of Technology, Curriculum & Instruction, and Legal thank you for your interest and respectfully ask for your patience until such time as they have the capacity to consider new requests. No new requests will be considered until after we have successfully launched the first month of school and established support for all existing applications.

With that, it's very likely that we already have access to an application that serves a similar function. Please review the <u>list of approved apps</u> and consult your Digital Learning Partner or content team as needed to find an app that supports your needs.

SFUSD staff must only use the apps and sites listed on the <u>list of approved apps</u>. If you have any questions, please submit a help ticket.

Cybersecurity: Frequently Asked Questions

How do I remember all these passwords you want me to have?

Don't use a password manager like 1Password, to remember, that way, when a site gets hacked you aren't compromising all your accounts.

I got an email asking me to send the number on the back of gift cards.

Don't do it, there is no legitimate reason to email the activation code to anybody.

I received an email saying I must change my password now, or lose access. , oh they give me this easy link to click on.

Any email that says you must do something right away or lose access, be audited, or other "bad" thing should be treated with skepticism. Don't click on that link or open that file. Call or log on to the system homepage instead.
