Questions about appeals: The appeals never went through and Coach A was wondering why we are
holding some kids in U15 and not letting them move up as well. Discussions about what Hockey
Manitoba has advised us regarding our U15 and U18 being separate and that we should not have 1st
year U15s playing up. He believes that his players will face a better and faster game in the U18s
because they have to slow down their game when they play with the U15s and then they have to go
play much faster and harder games in their AAA games. He feels developmentally they would benefit
from the U18.

- Martin, VP Admin: Still working with UCN about the boardroom but they only allow groups that
 have 2 million coverage and we only have one. Lynn will look into the cost of upgrading
 insurance as it most likely will cost less than what we currently are paying to book the TRCC

 - Norman Northstars has been in contact with Jessie regarding 3 players that need to be registered with TMHA and shared with Norman so that they can AP to the team. They want to register for free. Jessie clarified that they need to pay full price.
- Brad, On ice Officials Coordinator
 - Hand off has gone smoothly. Numbers are looking good.
- Evan, Equipment Manager
 - Has a few jerseys coming in and trying to get ahold of Sam regarding the DQ jerseys for
 U9. Needs to get more goalie jerseys for the house league.
- Dustin, Development
 - Dustin wants to have the directors send him their schedules.
 - U9 Development is already scheduled. Last year we lost money on this and so it was given a higher budget this year.
 - House League Development: House League Development. There were talks earlier this year about needing to do something different for house league. There were options put on the table about running more games. In the effort to make more meaningful hockey for our house league. I mentioned that the recipe is to close the skill gap within the house leagues. As development coordinator, I have to share my thoughts on how the past few house league seasons went, and how this one is slated to go. The theory of keeping the age groups together, having a large skill gap within each house league is a theory tried and failed. If you look at last years' house league in U13, in particular, there was such an imbalance in skill that many kids would barely touch the puck throughout the games. You had your top end kids running the ice, scoring the goals. I would challenge any statistician to look back at the score sheets to see just how imbalanced it was. I say this as a time keeper for many of the games my kid was involved in. When you field players with such a skill gap you create two issues. 1: a situation where lack of confidence takes the drive to succeed away from the less skilled of the group. 2: a situation where there is not enough competition for the higher skilled to meet their development needs. TMHA offers players of the higher skill level in house league to move into the next level house league for development purposes to mitigate having unbalanced groups. You can see this in section 4.1 n of our policies and procedures. Parents and players can decide if they whish to further develop in the next level house league if they were selected by a Rep coach for a AA team. How this avenue is beneficial to our house leagues is that, if used, it lowers the skill gap within the leagues, promotes confidence and in turn will create more meaningful hockey. The AA kids that want to move up will be more of a benefit the next level house league compared to their own, and will also develop themselves better individually. This would be noticed when the scoresheet has more than three players recording goals. I also say this as being a parent that has paid for 29 house league seasons in the past 13 years with 4 kids playing all at different skill levels with TMHA.
 - Leslie also stated that she only sees the same players on each time sheet that are scoring goals in U11.
 - O It always used to be that when a AA team was selected, the information was passed to the parents /players to use this development opportunity if they so choose. What was not allowed, was for coaches to have any persuasion on a kid's choice / outcome. This

protected the kid from being forced into the next level house league if the coach wanted them to, and left the decision solely to the parent/player. For some reason this year, when I suggested we reach out to parent about putting in their requests for advancement, there was hesitation from the board. Regardless of any one's thoughts, perceptions, this is a policy that we can, and should inform our association about. Because of the benefit to individual, team, and league development. We have a duty to abide by Hockey Canada's player development models. Our goal is to develop kids, and this happens in practice. We all know that. You could advertise our house league games on Monday Night Raw if you want. That won't make it meaningful. Having kids on the ice that believe they can make a difference will.

- Exhibition ice: Dustin created a simple spreadsheet for the exhibition ice. Teams would fill out the spreadsheet. First team listed would be the requesting team first team listed on the sheet as the requesting team. Brad will mark that the officials are lined up so we can confirm the ice. And once its confirmed, the team will be notified and Will can create a poster for the social media about the game.
- Christmas camp: Dustin talked to Ketchen at the beginning of the season about holding a spot for xmas break. Dustin will reach out to see if Ketchen is still interested, If not we will explore potentially having our coaches host a camp.
- Jessie reminds us that we need to make sure that we read the policy and have our policy down before making any decisions and votes.

 - Gives us a reminder that we need a release for our AP players from their main team to have a travel permit approved.

 - Started the development team and only has one second year coach. This second year coach wants to meet with Dustin. This coach will meet with Dustin on wednesday.
